## ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The residence at 59 Main Street was built c.1800 in the Georgian style. This 5x2 bay, wood frame, 2 story building sits on a granite block foundation. The building is clad with wood clapboards. The hip roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Two brick chimneys are located at the side walls. The center entrance contains a 4-panel wood door flanked by fluted pilasters with a full entablature above. A semi-circular fanlight with leaded glass is also above the entry. The fenestration is symmetrical. The windows contain 6/6 sash with flat surrounds and a molded drip cap. The cornerboards are thin and flat. The cornice is boxed. A rear ell is built with similar materials.

#### HISTORICAL NARRATIVE:

The house was owned by William D. Winsor in 1876. By 1903 it was owned by the faunce family. Both families were involved in the shipping business in Kingston. In 1912 a greenhouse was built behind the house. In 1943 Howland Lane was widened and the store which had been on the corner was moved behind the house and a greenhouse was added. By 1954 a large greenhouse had been built behind the house. The greenhouses were used by a florist business which flourished here during the early 20th century.
