ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The residence at 202 Pembroke Street was built c.1820 in the Federal style. This 5x2 bay, wood frame, 2 story building sits on a brick and granite foundation. The building is clad with flushboard scored to look like wood blocks on the facade with wood clapboards on the elevations. The side gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. A massive brick chimney is located at the center ridge. The center entrance is contained in a 1x1 bay which projects from the building wall. The entry contains a contemporary wood door flanked by full sidelights. The entry bay is enhanced with quoins and dentils. The windows contain 6/6 wood sash with flat surrounds and projecting hoods. The corners are articulated with quoins. The cornice is boxed with returns. A 2x3 bay, wood frame, gable roof bay projects from the rear of the building with a shed roof along the east elevation which shelters a secondary entrance. The west elevation has an exposed basement which contains a third entrance and several windows.

HISTORICAL NARRATIVE:

This area of Kingston was populated by the Reed family in the 19th century. The Reeds dammed Pine Brook to form a pond, called Reed Pond, and in 1844 Edward Reed is listed as having a tack factory at this site. The 1876 map lists Edwin Reed having a residence and mill at this site. By 1903 L. Jones residence and sawmill is at this location. The building appears to have been heavily renovated and the extent of remaining original fabric is unknown.
