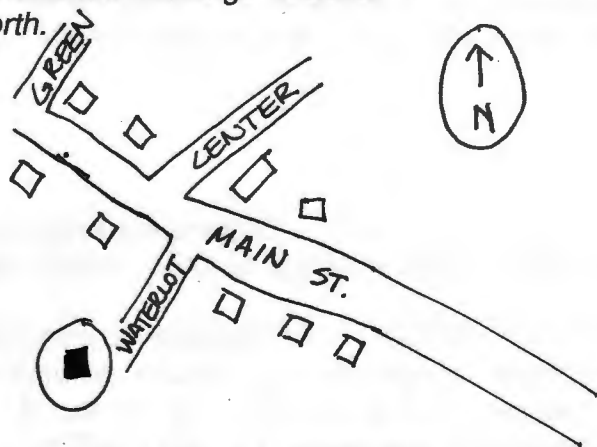

The funeral home at 216 Main Street was built in 1957 in the ranch style with a side gable roof. This 6 x 4 bay, wood frame, one story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a concrete foundation. The building is clad with wood clapboards on the facade and wood shingles on the side and rear elevations. The side gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. The entrance contains wood double doors with a plain surround. The entrance is protected by a gable roof "porte cochere" supported by simple columns. The windows contain 8/8 sash with flat surrounds. The cornerboards are thin and flat. The cornice is thin with a shallow molding.

A ramp leads to a side entrance which is protected by a gable roof enclosure. A large asphalt parking lot is in front of the building.
