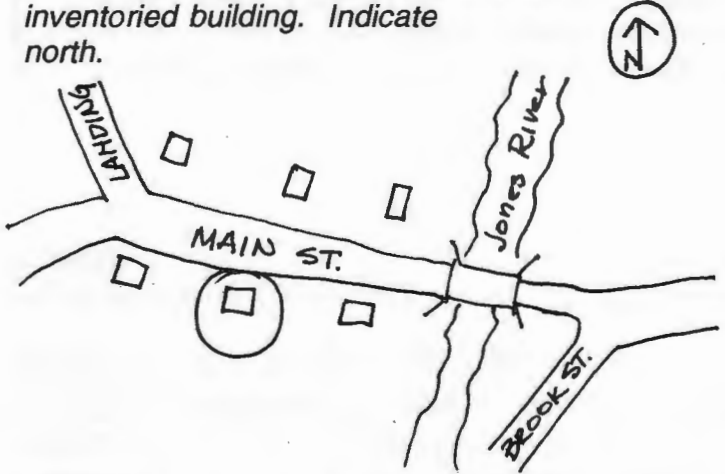

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION  *see continuation sheet*

*Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.*

The residence at 178 Main Street was built in 1916. According to the present owners, the building was originally a barn or half cape and later enlarged. The present house is a cape with a side gable roof with front and back shed dormers. This 3x2 bay, wood frame, one-and-one-half story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a stone foundation. The building is clad with wood shingles. The side gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. One brick chimney is on the exterior end wall. The entrance is off-center and contains a wood, 6-panel door flanked by full sidelights and a plain surround. The windows contain wood 6/6 sash with flat surrounds. The cornerboards are thin and flat. The cornice is thin with a shallow molding.

A one story wing is attached to the length of the rear of the building. A garage built in 1981 is also on the property.

A building was built on this site in 1916 and was owned by Martha Cobb. This property changed ownership several times since. In 1943 it was purchased by Frederick E. and Rose M. Corrow. In 1955 Robert John and Ann Andrews purchased it. By 1963 Doris E. and John J. Treadwell III held ownership. In 1971 it was purchased by George P. and Judith C. Sakalosky. This house was purchased in 1964 by Dennis and Barbara Carvalho, they are the present owners.

This cape style house is common in Kingston and on the South Shore.
