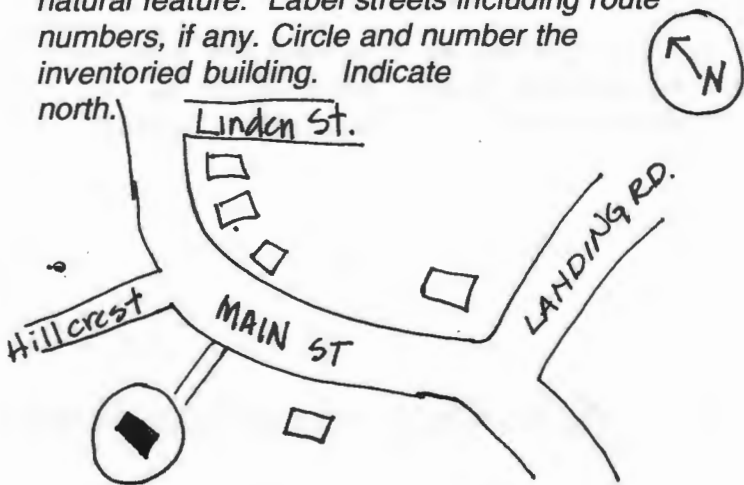

Describe architectural features Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The residence at 190 Main Street was built in 1986 in the cape style with a side gable roof. This 4x2 bay, wood frame, one-and-a-half story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a concrete foundation. The building is clad with wood clapboards. The side gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. One brick chimney is located on the interior near the center of the house. The entrance contains a new vinyl clad door with sidelights and a plain surround. The windows contain vinyl sash with flat surrounds. The cornerboards are thin and flat. The cornice is thin with a shallow molding.

A shed built is on the rear of the property.
