

The residence at 197 Main Street was built between 1948 and 1957 in the ranch style with a side gable roof. This 3x2 bay, wood frame, one story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a concrete foundation. The building is clad with wood shingles. The side gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. One brick chimney is located on the rear/center of the house. The entrance contains a steel, 6-panel door with a plain surround and aluminum storm door. The windows contain vinyl 6/6 sash with flat surrounds. The cornerboards are thin and flat. The cornice is thin with a shallow molding.

A one story screen porch/breezeway is attached to the side of the house and a one stall garage is accessed via the screen porch.
