

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION *see continuation sheet*

The residence at 207 Main Street was built in 1984 in the gambrel style. This 4 x 2 bay, wood frame, one-and-a-half story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a concrete foundation. The building is clad with wood shingles. The gambrel roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Two single dormers project from the facade. One brick chimney is located on the rear elevation of the house. The entrance contains a wood door with a plain surround. The windows contain 6/6 vinyl sash and are a mix of double hung and casement styles with flat surrounds. A bay window projects from the first floor side elevation. The cornerboards are thin and flat.

A One-and-a-half story, wood frame, front gable barn sits towards the rear of the property.


