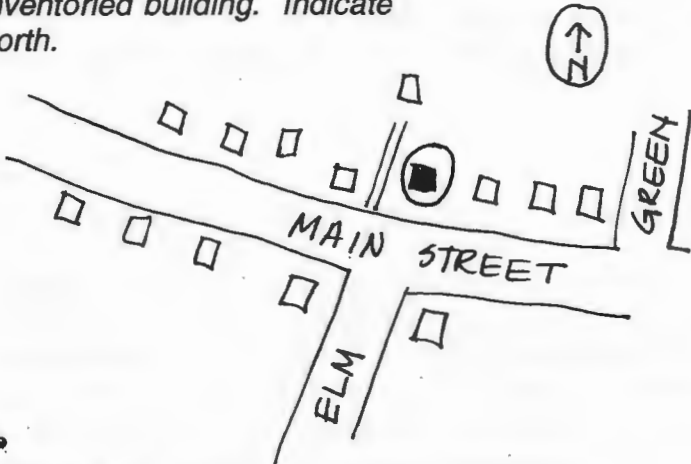

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ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION *see continuation sheet*

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The residence at 229 Main Street was built in 1900 with a front gable roof. This 3 x 4 bay, wood frame, two story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a brick foundation. The building is clad with wood clapboards. The front gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. A shed dormer and skylights pierce the roof slopes. One brick chimney is located on the rear of the house. The entrance contains a wood door flanked by half sidelights with wide molded surround. The windows contain vinyl replacement 1/1 sash with flat surrounds. The cornerboards are thin and flat. The cornice is thin with a shallow molding. The building has a one story wrap porch across the facade and side of the building. The porch has a shed roof supported by square posts with a balustrade. A bay window projects from the side of the building. A two story 1x1 bay projects from the front corner at an angle. The windows in this bay have colored glass transoms. A two story ell of similar construction is at the rear of the building.

This building has had significant remodeling and much of the original exterior materials have been changed.

This house is one of several residences built on Main Street in the early 20th century. The house has been heavily remodeled on the exterior and although it can be visually identified as an early 20th century building, it has lost much of its historical architectural integrity.
