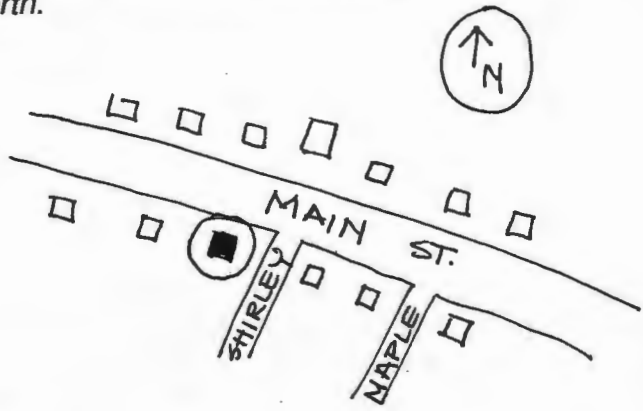

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION *see continuation sheet*

Describe architectural features Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The residence at 258 Main Street was built in 1910 in the vernacular style with a front gable roof. This 2 x 3 bay, wood frame, one-and-a-half story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a granite block foundation. The building is clad with wood shingles. The front gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. A shed dormer projects from the side slope. One brick chimney is located in the center of the house at the ridge. The entrance contains a wood panel door with a plain surround and is covered with a bracketed door hood. The windows contain 6/6 wood sash with flat surrounds. A bay window projects from the front of the building, next to the front entrance. The cornerboards are thin and flat. The cornice is thin with a shallow molding. A two story ell is attached to the rear of the building.
