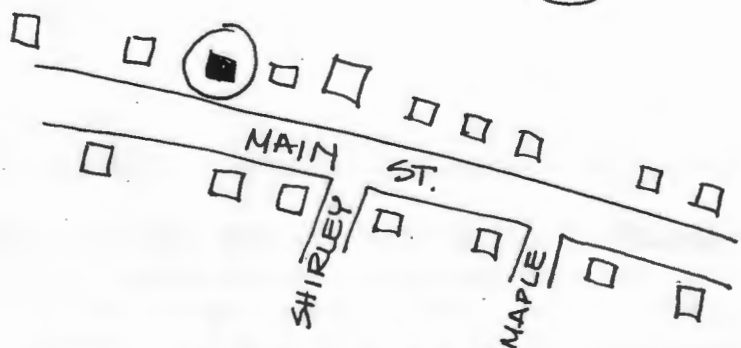

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION *see continuation sheet*

Describe architectural features Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The residence at 265 Main Street was built in 1948 in the cape style with a side gable roof. This 3 x 2 bay, wood frame, one-and-a-half story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a concrete block foundation. The building is clad with wood shingles. The side gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. One brick chimney is located in the center of the house at the ridge. The entrance contains a wood door with a plain surround. The door is protected by a door hood supported by a posts and a trellis. The windows contain 6/6 sash with flat surrounds. The cornerboards are thin and flat. The cornice is thin with a shallow molding. A small room is attached to the side of the building.

A garage and workshop are at the rear of the property.

This building was built in 1948 on a 21,742 piece of land. George E. Cobb was the first owner. The present owners are George and Edith Cobb. The chimney was repaired in 1965 and the garage was built in 1981.
