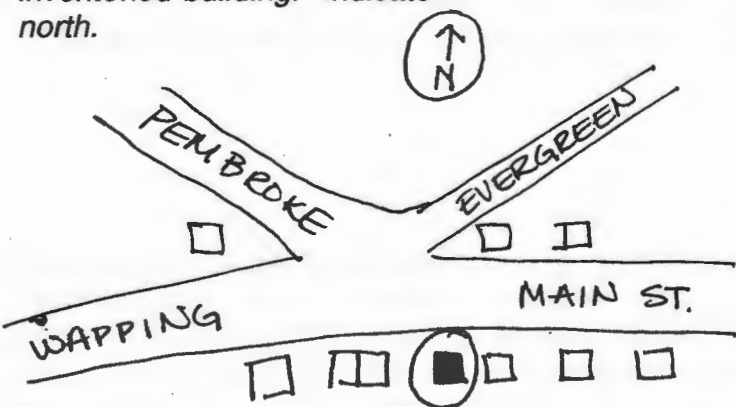

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION *see continuation sheet*

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The residence at 282 Main Street was built in 1891 in the vernacular style with a front gable roof. This 3 x 4 bay, wood frame, two story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a brick foundation. The building is clad with vinyl siding. The front gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. A single shed roof dormer pierces the roof slope on one side. One brick chimney is located in the center of the house at the ridge. The off-center entrance contains a early 20th century wood door with a square glass pane in the upper section and a plain surround. A bracketed door hood protects the entry. The windows contain 2/2 wood sash. A bay window projects from the facade next to the entry. The cornice is recessed with a shallow molding. A two story ell is at the rear side of the building. A shed roof porch supported with columns and a balustrade wraps from the side of the building to the rear ell.

This building was built c. 1891. It is similar in design to the building at 280 Main Street. This building has had fewer alterations than the 280 Main Street building. This building has been sided with vinyl but the other elements, door hood, porch, and window configuration are intact. This is a common building form found in many towns on the south shore and in most communities with a good supply of late 19th century vernacular buildings. The plan most likely came from a plan book and was duplicated by the same or different builders all over town.
