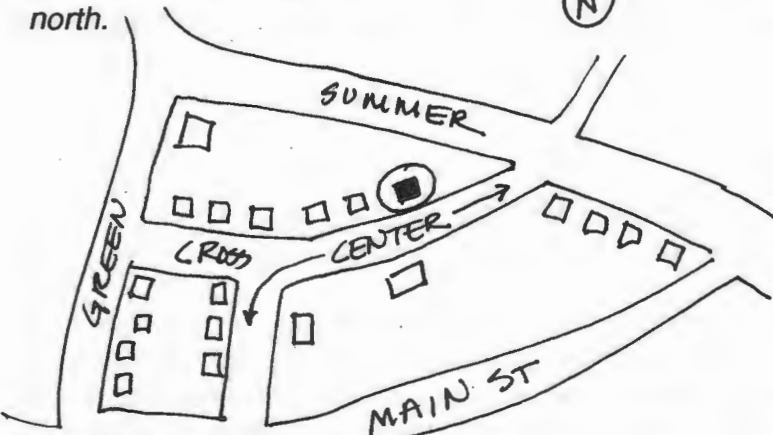

Describe architectural features Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The residence at 3 Center Street was built in 1960 in the ranch style with a side gable roof. This 3 x 2 bay, wood frame, one story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a concrete foundation. The building is clad with fiberglass shingles. The side gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. One brick chimney is located on the rear roof slope of the house. The off-center entrance contains a wood panel door with a plain surround. The windows contain 8/8 wood sash with molded surrounds. The cornice is thin with a shallow molding. The garage projects from the front, side of the building.
