BUILDING FORM

Describe architectural features Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The residence at 8 Summer Street was built in 1852 in the ranch style with a side gable roof. This 4 x 2 bay, wood frame, one story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a concrete foundation. The building is clad with wood shingles. The side gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. One brick chimney is located on the interior of the house on the rear slope. The recessed entrance contains a wood door with three diagonal lights with a plain surround. The windows contain 1/1 vinyl sash with flat surrounds. The cornice is thin with a shallow molding. On the side elevation a small entry are connects a one stall garage to the house.
