

Describe architectural features Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The residence at 17 Summer Street was built in 1985 in the cape style with a side gable roof. This 3 x 2 bay, wood frame, two story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a concrete foundation. The building is clad with wood. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Three single front gable dormers pierce the roof on the front slope. The entrance contains a wood door flanked by half sidelights with a plain surround. The windows contain vinyl sash with flat surrounds. The cornerboards are thin and flat. The cornice is thin with a shallow molding.
