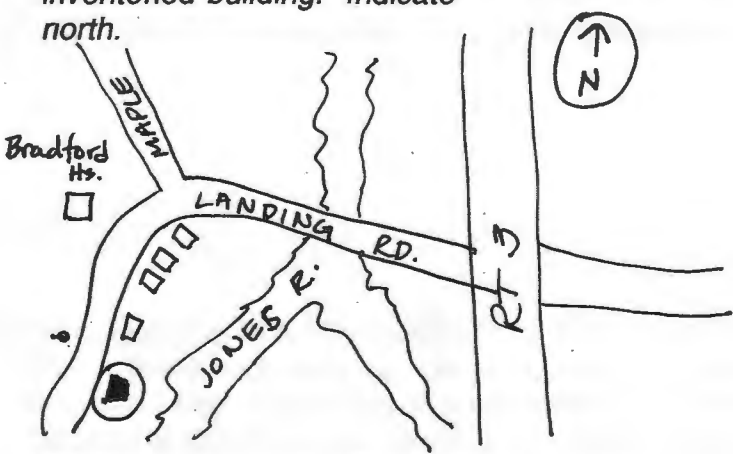

Describe architectural features Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The residence at 49 Landing Road was built in c. 1870 in the vernacular style with a front gable roof. This 3 x 4 bay, wood frame, two story building is rectangular in plan and sits on a stone foundation. The building is clad with aluminum siding. The front gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. One brick chimney is located in the center of the house at the ridge. The entrance is a one story, 1 x 1 bay projection with a shed roof and contains a wood panel door with a plain surround. The windows contain vinyl replacement sash with flat surrounds. The cornice is thin with a shallow molding. A one story shed roof room is on the side elevation.

The residence at 49 Landing Road was built in c.1870 on 13,068 sf of land. This building and the house located at 41 Landing Road are similar in form and may have been built by the same builder. They were both late 19th century buildings and their occupants may have had something to do with fishing or boating on the river.
