## ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The residence at 86 Main Street was built c.1846 in the Federal style and later updated to display Italianate decoration. This 5x2 bay, wood frame, 2 story building sits on a granite foundation. The building is clad with wood clapboards. the hip roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Two brick chimneys are located on the side wall of the building. Two more chimneys are located in the rear ell at the ridge. The center entrance contains a 4-panel wood door flanked by full sidelights. The windows contain 6/6 wood sash. the windows on the first floor facade are larger than the second floor. Directly above the door, a gable pierces the roof slope. This gable contains a large window with a pediment above. The corners articulated with 3/4 round molding. The cornice is boxed with drip pendant brackets. The rear ell is a 2 story gable building is constructed with similar materials.

#### HISTORICAL NARRATIVE:

This building was built by Philander Cobb in 1846. In 1845, Philander Cobb bought a store building in Plymouth, took it down and reconstructed it on Main Street in Kingston. The store provided dry goods and everyday supplies. Cobb's store, located at 83 Main Street, has been converted to a residence.
