# ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TOWN OF KINGSTON

## ANNUAL MARCH MEETING

In pursuance of a warrant duly served the inhabitants of the Town of Kingston qualified to vote in town affairs met at their Town House on Saturday, the 6th day of March, 1909 at 6.30 o'clock A. M. The meeting having been called to order by Henry S. Everson, Town Clerk, David Clifton Freeman was chosen as Moderator. The following officers were chosen by ballot:

*Selectmen.*—Thomas W. Bailey, William J. O'Brien, Albert E. Holmes.

*Town Clerk.*—Henry S. Everson.

*Assessor.*—Albert E. Holmes for 3 years.

*Auditor.*—Lemuel R. Ford.

*Collector of Taxes.*—Henry S. Everson.

*Waters Commissioners.*—Charles H. Drew, 3 years; Samuel G. Austin, 2 years.

*Overseers of the Poor.*—Thomas W. Bailey, William J. O'Brien, Albert E. Holmes.

*Highway Surveyor.*—E. Elbridge Atwood.

*Constables.*—Wendell O. Chandler, Ephraim Pratt.

*School Committee.*—Frank L. Chandler, 3 years; Galen E. Pratt, 3 years.

*Treasurer.*—Henry S. Everson.

*Trustees of Public Library.*—Leander S. Cole, 3 years; John P. Farrington, 3 years.

*Tree Warden.*—Carl C. Faunce.

On the question, shall licenses for the sale of intoxicating liquors be granted in this town, 91 voted Yes, 204 No.

The meeting for the transaction of other business was opened at 2 o'clock P. M. and the following persons were chosen to fill other offices and the following votes were passed:

*Pound Keeper.*—George L. Churchill.

*Field Driver.*—John I. Drew.

*Surveyors of Lumber.*—Stillman B. Small, Walter C. Hammond, M. Parker Delano.

*Surveyors of Wood.*—George B. Holmes, Daniel Weston.

*Fish Committee.*—Wendell O. Chandler, Fred A. Hernandez, Enoch W. Padelford.

*Town House Committee.*—The Selectmen.

*Fence Viewers.*—Alexander Holmes, Carl C. Faunce, Nahum Sampson.

*Superintendent of Moth-Work.*—Left in the hands of the Selectmen.

*Voted,* That the care of the Burying Ground be placed in the hands of the Tree Warden.

*Voted,* That no payment be made from the treasury except upon orders from the Selectmen or direct vote of the Town authorizing the same, and that no order upon the treasury shall be paid after the collector shall have received his warrant for the collection of taxes, until the person in whose favor the order is drawn shall have paid his tax.

*Voted,* That all taxes be paid on or before October 10th next, and the collector proceed and is instructed to collect by legal process all taxes unpaid after that date.

*Voted,* That interest at the rate of six per cent, per annum be charged on all unpaid taxes after the 10th of October next.

*Voted,* That the Treasurer be authorized to hire money, with the approval of a majority of the Selectmen in anticipation of the taxes of the current year, and to be paid from the same.

*Voted,* That the report of the committee on the Brockton damage case be accepted.

*Voted,* That the report of Town officers as printed be accepted.

*Voted,* That the financial year of the town close Dec. 31st, 1909, and that the annual town meeting be held on the first Saturday in March 1910, and be opened at 6.30 a. m.

*Voted,* To accept a road as laid out by the Selectmen, from Main street near the Plymouth line to the land of the Old Colony Railroad Company.

*Voted,* That E. Elbridge Atwood be a committee of one to build the same.

*Voted,* That the matter of extending the water pipes, on Pembroke St., to a point near the Railroad bridge be left in the hands of the Water Commissioners and to report at some future meeting and the probable expense.

*Voted,* That the extension of the water pipes on Howland Lane, so called, to East ave., and on a certain avenue in Rocky Nook Park, be left in the hands of the Water Commissioners to investigate and report with the probable expense at some future meeting to be called before the assessment of taxes of the current year.

*Voted,* That the sum of \$100.00 be appropriated to investigate the laying of water pipes on Howland Lane extension.

*Voted,* That the Selectmen be instructed to inform themselves, of the law lately passed in regard to the clams and report at some future meeting.

*Voted,* That at least five per cent. of the Highway appropriation be expended on foot paths, and the matter be left in the hands of the Highway Surveyor, and that durable materials be used.

Shall an act passed by the General Court in the year 1908, entitled, "An act to provide for the protection of forest or sprout lands from fire," be accepted by this town?

*Voted*, That the Town Clerk deposit one ballot marked "Yes" to accept the above Act.

*Voted*, That the sum of \$10.00 be paid to David Clifton Freeman for services as Moderator.

*Voted*, That the recommendations of the Selectmen with the addition of \$2,400.00 for forest fires be accepted.

*Voted*, That the sum of \$150.00 be added to the appropriation for Street Lights.

Under the vote of the town, authorizing it, a new water wheel has been installed at the pumping station, replacing the old wheel that has been in service since the water system was introduced in 1886, and which was worn out.

110 feet of 4-inch pipe have been laid in Prospect St. and 15 new service pipe connections have been made which brings the total up to 472. 2 service pipes to houses and 1 to a watering trough have been renewed. 4 service boxes have been renewed, 3 hydrants have been taken out and repaired, and 3 new hydrants have been put in, also 1 new stand pipe.

Particular attention is called to the increase in number of pupils as will be seen by the superintendent's report.

The need of additional accommodations at Rocky Nook, both in the Grammar and Primary schools, provided the attendance still further increases, should receive earnest consideration.

The new school house was first occupied at the beginning of the fall term by grades 5, 6, 7 and 8. This building was erected at a total cost of \$8,618.25. While costing somewhat more than the original estimate, the town has a modern, thoroughly equipped school building which relieves the crowded condition formerly existing at the Primary and High schools.

All that remains to be done at the new school house is the grading of the lot.

In our report last year mention was made of the necessity of repairs and alterations at the High School building. On account of the expense attending the building of the new school house, it was considered best not to do more than was absolutely necessary, and so only minor repairs were made. Additional repairs and alterations should be attended to during the present year.

During the summer vacation the interiors of the schoolhouses at Northwest and Silver Lake were put into thorough repair, ceiling and walls whitened and tinted, the woodwork painted, and the old seats replaced by single ones that had been made available by the furnishing of the new schoolhouse. At Silver Lake the ceiling was so loose that a new one had to be put on. Painting the outside is all that is now necessary to put these buildings in excellent condition. This should be done during the present year. The school wagon used in transporting pupils to and from the Silver Lake school having become unfit for further use, a new one was purchased to take its place, at a cost of \$50.00.

The well at the Wapping school having been condemned by the inspector of the state board of health, a new one was driven there which promises to furnish an abundant supply of good water.

Our chairman, Mr. Galen E. Pratt, having decided to move

to a nearby town, tendered his resignation to take effect in September. At a joint convention of the Selectmen and School Committee, Mr. Frederick G. Brackett was unanimously elected to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Pratt.

The School Committee has approved the purchase of a large number of stereographs for the library with the design of having them circulated in the schools for use in connection with the work. These have proved of great value to the teachers and of much interest to the pupils.

An unfortunate feature of the closing of the schools, owing to the prevalence of diphtheria, was the necessary omission of the graduating exercises. While this was deeply regretted, the committee considered the seriousness of the situation demanded the action.

There has been a large attendance of visitors at the various schools upon the occasion of special events, such as Lincoln's Birthday, Thanksgiving and Christmas exercises, also exhibition week. While this is gratifying, a larger attendance at the regular sessions is hoped for and would be appreciated.

We recommend the following appropriations for the necessary expenses for the current year:

We are fortunate this year in the fact that the number of changes to be recorded is smaller than usual. Miss Newman's call to a larger field of work in Quincy was noted in the last report. As her successor here Miss Florence L. Bean of Everett was selected and she is proving herself well qualified to fill the position. During the summer vacation Miss Carleton, who had been connected with the high school for the past ten years and who was one of our most valued and efficient teachers, resigned to accept a more desirable position in her own town. To fill this vacancy Miss Genivieve M. Haven of Somerville was chosen from a number of promising applicants. Miss Haven is a graduate of Tufts College and is well equipped for her work. She is getting good results from her classes. In September Miss Marston who had been on a leave of absence for the previous school year returned to her work at the Rocky Nook Grammar school and Miss Bates who had acted as substitute during Miss Marston's absence

took charge of the Northwest school which under her direction is continuing to prosper.

The other teachers have shown in their respective schools the same fidelity and efficiency which have characterized their work in the past.

The most notable event of the past school year has been the completion and occupation of the new school house. Besides providing modern and commodious quarters for the two schools for which it is designed it has relieved the overcrowding at the high school and has furnished suitable accommodations for the lower primary school in the room formerly occupied by the third and fourth grades. To fully adapt the high school building to the needs of the school some changes in the internal arrangements will be necessary, but even in its present condition the school is better accommodated than at any time hitherto since the extension of its work called for the additional teachers.

A week before the close of the school year in June the Selectmen as a precautionary measure on account of an outbreak of diphtheria ordered the closing of all the schools. That there was no further spread of the disease was probably due to their prompt action. This enforced closing also prevented the graduating exercises of the high school from being held and the diplomas were privately presented. The program that had been prepared, together with the Adams' Prize awards, will be found at the close of this report.

Reference to the tables of membership and attendance will show that this year again we have shown an increase in all the items. While a part of this is due to the fact that the Northwest school has been re-opened and we have had there a dozen pupils who did not formerly attend our schools we still have a considerable increase in the number of our own pupils, and the schools at the present time will show a still larger enrolment. The schools at the center of the town are now well provided for but those at Rocky Nook must have further accommodations or they will be unable to maintain their efficiency. Crowding in

the Grammar school there can be relieved to a certain extent by conveying pupils to the Center schools but children of the first two grades should be provided for in their own schools if possible. Last year the Rocky Nook Primary school had an average membership of forty-nine and an average attendance of forty-four. Thirty-six is about the capacity of the room though a few more seats can be placed. It is impossible, however, to place enough seats to accommodate the whole membership. Halfday sessions therefore are the only possible means of providing for them. When it is considered that a large proportion of the pupils are from foreign homes, that a considerable number enter each year without the ability to speak or to understand a single word of English, and that in the face of these disadvantages the teacher has only a single session daily for each grade the problem of the teacher will be partially understood. The matter is not so much a local one as might appear at first sight. It concerns the whole school system. If we are to maintain our schools at a high state of efficiency the pupils must be started right. Poorly prepared pupils in the lower grades can rarely make good their deficiency further along. A teacher may overcome unfavorable conditions for a while but it is not fair to require her to try to do so permanently. The conditions that called for remedy at the center of the town have been corrected and the next demand will be from Rocky Nook.

Towards the close of the spring term of the schools several days were set apart when a special effort was made to have a large representation of parents and citizens visit the schools and see them at their work. Material had been preserved during the year and was displayed as well as circumstances would permit. Teachers were also given the opportunity to see the work of other schools. While the exhibit held in the Town Hall has the advantage of allowing a view of the work of the several schools side by side at the least expenditure of effort on the part of the observer it is after all an exhibit of the work and the most important side, the pupil is so far subordinated as to be

almost lost sight of. Over four hundred visitors to the several schools were registered and although the number of different persons was much less it was felt that the exhibit was of great value to all concerned.

The inspection of the schools by the school physician has been more effective the past year than ever before but it would be of greater value to the children if there were a more general co-operation on the part of the parents. In many cases where children have been excluded from school as a precaution against spread of contagion they have been allowed to mingle with their playmates at home and on the streets in a manner to almost defeat the purpose of their exclusion. In other cases parents have seemed to welcome the exclusion of their children as an excuse for not requiring their attendance and have neglected to take any steps to remove the conditions that caused the exclusion until warned "that no physical or mental condition which is capable of correction shall avail as a defence unless it shall be made to appear that the defendant has employed all reasonable measures for the correction of the condition."

In several cases children who were known to have been exposed to disease have been kept in school until it made its appearance and other pupils had been infected. Of course the instances enumerated above are of the so called milder diseases but it is just these diseases that have several times gone through schools in our town. Scarlet fever or diphtheria cannot gain a foothold in our schools because the first case is promptly detected and isolated. If all were sufficiently interested it would seem that we might enjoy a similar immunity in respect to other diseases and that much time now lost to our schools might be saved.

Grateful acknowledgment is made to the Women's Relief Corps for schoolroom flags presented to the several schools and for a large framed copy of the Declaration of Independence presented to the Grammar school; also to Mrs. Mary Wallace Packard for a choice selection of books given to the Northwest school as a foundation for a school library.

Thanks are due to all who have in any way contributed to make the year the successful one that it has been in our schools. For the attainment of the unusually high record of attendance parents, pupils and teachers should share in the praise.

Appreciation is due the former chairman of the School Committee, Mr. Galen E. Pratt; for his zealous efforts in behalf of the schools. When retirement from active duties gave him leisure he devoted the increased time to the welfare of the cause in which he was so deeply interested and his name appeared more often than any other in the lists of visitors to the schools. In this way he obtained a familiarity with the conditions existing in all parts of the town which made his counsel of great value.

I am unwilling to close without referring to the cordial relations that have existed this year, as in former years, between committee and superintendent, and between community and school department. This mutual confidence and respect are the strongest kind of a guarantee that our schools will continue to deserve the loyal support of the community.

#### REPORT OF SCHOOL PHYSICIAN.

During the year ending December 31, 1909, the School Physician has made twenty-seven visits to schools and a total of 505 examinations of pupils, in accordance with the provisions of the law. All pupils having been examined once, and again whenever referred by the teacher.

The following is a list of diseases or diseased conditions found:

Decayed teeth, 312.

Enlarged tonsils, 118.

Impetigo contagiosa, 7.

Pediculosis, 2.

Acute conjunctivitis, and pharyngitis, one each.

Notices were sent to the parent or guardian in each case where any diseased condition was found, and where the condition was a communicable one the pupil excluded from school until a certificate of health from some physician was presented, stating that all danger of communicating the disease to others was passed.

While no statistics are available for previous years, it is a noticeable fact that the number of pupils excluded during the past year is much less than at any time previous, showing a commendable spirit of co-operation on the part of parents.

A partial list of diseases for which pupils may be excluded follows:

Scarlet fever, diphtheria, measles, mumps, chicken pox, whooping cough, small pox, pediculosis, tonsillitis, ringworm, impetigo, scabies, rotheln, acute conjunctivitis, erysipelas, and tuberculosis.



### MAPLE AVENUE SCHOOLHOUSE, KINGSTON.

The latest acquisition in town buildings is the new schoolhouse on Maple avenue. This is a two-room building, so planned that another room can be added without interfering with the present building.

This building was designed by Mr. Edward F. Stevens, a Boston architect, whose large experience in designing institutions enabled him to give the Town the best and most modern ideas in hygienic schoolhouse construction.

The exterior of the building is designed in the simple early Colonial type without ornamentation, of wood construction, with shingled roof.

One enters through large double doors from a broad, open porch which will afford shelter in stormy weather.

The schoolrooms, two in number, are airy, well lighted, heated and ventilated. Besides the two schoolrooms on the ground floor, there is a teachers' room, coat rooms, and the staircases leading to the basement. The rooms and stairs are so planned that a teacher standing near the entrance can control either room and the entrances to the two playrooms in the basement, the staircase being open.

The basement playrooms are very light and the toilet the most approved for schoolhouse work.

The heater room contains the two furnaces and the stack heaters, and is accessible from the rear by an incline.

The same careful, hygienic detail used by Mr. Stevens in his hospital buildings for door and window finish, transoms and base boards, is used here. Except for the blackboard ledges, there are no projecting surfaces to catch and hold the dust and germs, and no thresholds to stumble over.

The coat and hat racks are the ones adopted by the City of Boston's schools, and hold each garment in such a manner that it touches neither another garment nor the wall.

The dadoes around the room are of hand plaster, painted, avoiding the usual cracks of a sheathing dado.

The blackboards are of slate set on a line with the plaster. Card racks are arranged above the boards.
