ANNUAL MARCH MEETING

In pursuance of a warrant duly served the inhabitants of the Town of Kingston qualified to vote in town affairs, met at their Town House on Saturday, the 4th day of March, 1911, at 6.30 o'clock A. M. The meeting having been called to order by Henry S. Everson, Town Clerk, Charles H. Drew was chosen as Moderator. The following officers were chosen by ballot:

Selectmen.—Thomas W. Bailey, Albert E. Holmes, Walter H. Faunce.

Town Clerk.—Henry S. Everson.

Assessor.—Thomas W. Bailey for three years.

Auditor.—Leauel R. Ford.

Collector of Taxes.—Henry S. Everson.

Water Commissioner.—Samuel G. Austin, 3 years.

Overseers of the Poor.—Thomas W. Bailey, Albert E. Holmes, Walter H. Faunce.

Highway Surveyor.—E. Elbridge Atwood.

Constables.—Wendell O. Chandler, Ephraim Pratt.

School Committee.—Oscar C. Swope, 3 years; John T. Thompson, 3 years.

Treasurer.—Henry S. Everson.

Trustees of Public Library.—Henry L. Barker, 3 years; Harvey A. Soule, 3 years; Arthur W. Pierce, 1 year.

Tree Warden.—Carl C. Faunce.

On the question, shall licenses for the sale of intoxicating liquors be granted in this town, 136 voted Yes, 180 No.

The meeting for the transaction of other business was opened at 2 o'clock P. M. and the following persons were chosen to fill other offices and the following votes were passed:

Pound Keeper.—John H. Hathaway.

Field Driver.—Winfield R. Keene.

Surveyors of Lumber.—Stillman B. Small, George B. Holmes, M. Parker Delano.

Surveyors of Wood.—George B. Holmes, E. Elbridge Atwood.

Fish Committee.—Arthur B. Holmes, Michael Malone, George E. Cushman.

Town House Committee.—The Selectmen.

Fence Viewers.—Alexander Holmes, Carl C. Faunce, Nahum Sampson.

Voted. That the care of the Burying Ground be placed in the hands of the Tree Warden.

Voted. That no payment be made from the treasury except upon orders from the Selectmen or direct vote of the Town authorizing the same, and that no order upon the treasury shall be paid after the collector shall have received his warrant for the collection of taxes, until the person in whose favor the order is drawn shall have paid his tax.

Voted. That all taxes be paid on or before October 10th next, and the collector proceed and is instructed to collect by legal process all taxes unpaid after that date.

Voted. That interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum be charged on all unpaid taxes after the 10th of October next.

Voted. That the report of town officers as printed be accepted.

Voted. That the financial year of the town close Dec. 31, 1911, and that the annual town meeting be held on the first Saturday in March 1912, and be opened at 6.30 A. M.

Voted. That at least fifteen per cent. of the highway appro-

priation be applied to sidewalks, and the matter be placed in the hands of the highway surveyor.

Voted. That the Selectmen be instructed to make such rules and regulations regarding the taking of clams and other shell-fish as may seem just and reasonable, and that when such rules and regulations are made, they shall appoint a committee of three persons to attend to the enforcement of the same, and that the sum of \$100 be appropriated therefor.

Voted. That the town treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen be and hereby is authorized to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of taxes of the present municipal year to an amount not exceeding in the aggregate \$12,000, and to issue a note or notes therefor, payable within one year, any debt or debts incurred under this vote to be paid from the taxes of the present municipal year.

Voted. That the Water Commissioners be and hereby are authorized to extend the water pipes along Howland's Lane, so-called, or otherwise, and into and along the streets or ways of Rocky Nook Park, so-called. That the Water Commissioners before making such extensions shall obtain such leases or quit-claims from the owners of the streets or ways of said Park as shall safeguard the town's interests in the laying, repairing and maintaining of said pipes in said streets or ways.

That the Water Commissioners be authorized to fix such special rates for water takers, as in their judgment are fair and reasonable, and that the sum of \$5,000 be appropriated to defray the expense of such extension.

Voted. That the Treasurer be and hereby is authorized to borrow a sum not exceeding \$5,000, and to issue therefor, the notes of the town each for the sum of \$500, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding 4½ per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually, dated June 1, 1911, and payable one at the end of one year from said date, and one at the end of each year thereafter, until all are paid, the said notes to be signed by the Treasurer, and counter-signed by a majority of the Selectmen.

Voted, That the town accept the scenery as presented by the Kingston Dramatic Club, and make such alterations as may be necessary, subject to the approval of the State Building Inspector, and that the sum of \$500 be appropriated to make such alterations and repairs, and that the Selectmen be a committee to make such alterations.

Voted, That the Water Commissioners be authorized to extend the service pipes provided that proper quitclaim may be secured for laying and maintaining pipes to any point needed where in their judgment the investment will net the required 6 per cent. called for in general.

Voted, That the town provide additional accommodations at Howland's Lane school house, Rocky Nook, at a total cost not exceeding \$3,000.00.

Voted, To postpone Art. 7 to see if the town will purchase a spraying machine.

Voted, That no stone roads be built within the current year, and that the larger proportion of the highway appropriation be expended in repairing the highways outside the limits of the village.

Voted, That 25 cents per hour be paid for labor on highway.

Voted, That \$50 be appropriated and placed in the hands of the Selectmen for shade trees.

Voted, That the sum of \$10.00 be paid Charles H. Drew for services as moderator.

The extension of the Water System in Howland's Lane and Rocky Nook Park that was authorized in 1911 required the laying of 2,365 feet of 6-inch and 4,063 feet of 4-inch iron pipe. Every street in the park was piped and all pipe was laid

below the reach of frost, excepting at the railroad crossing. All the 4-inch pipe that had been previously laid in Howland's Lane was taken up and replaced by 6-inch, thus providing for possible future extensions of the system along the shore, where cottages will certainly be built.

Forty-five new services have been connected in the park and nine in other parts of the town. Three hydrants were condemned and replaced, and others that are leaking must be replaced this year for they are too old to be worth repairing.

The 4-inch main in Crescent street and thence to Plymouth line is badly choked with rust and gives poor service to some of the water takers in that section. If a fire should occur there our hosemen would probably find the water pressure to be of little use.

We recommend that authority be given us to improve upon these conditions by laying new and larger pipe.

The dam at the pumping station is old and very leaky, which means that water power there is running to waste through the leaks and that electric power must be bought in its place. The dam is not worth repairing. We recommend that the building of a new one be authorized, and that the Warrant for Town Meeting should contain articles under which these matters of new main pipe and a new dam may be considered.

The recommendation of the Committee with reference to providing additional school accommodations at Rocky Nook, which was made in their report for 1910, was adopted by a vote of the town at the March meeting and the sum of \$3,000 was appropriated therefor. No provision having been made for a committee to carry out the vote, that duty legally fell to the Selectmen.

It will be noticed that the Superintendent in his report again calls attention to the unsatisfactory conditions existing at Rocky Nook.

An attempt has been made to relieve the crowded condition, which has been partially successful. The relief, however, is only temporary, and the means of relief a make-shift.

It was the belief of the Committee at the time their recommendation was made that the object desired could best be accomplished, and at the least expense to the town, by adding a story to the Howland's Lane building. Now that the need of more room is still further pronounced the wisdom of considering some other plan is apparent.

The fact that the population is rapidly increasing in the southern part of the town should not be lost sight of by our citizens. As the population increases, so the need of further school accommodations increases.

During the year the Village Club brought to the attention of the people the Extension School of Agriculture. Through the efforts of the club a two days' meeting was held at the Town Hall, at which Dr. Stimson, special agent of the State Board of Education, various Amherst professors, and others, gave much interesting and valuable information. The Committee is desirous of knowing to what extent the need of such a school exists in Kingston.

During the year the buildings at Silver Lake and Wapping have been newly shingled, a wire fence has been provided at the High School, the interior of the building at Stony Brook has been painted and a new floor laid. The school wagon used

in transporting pupils to and from the Indian Pond district having become so badly out of repair, a new wagon has been provided which accomplishes admirably the purpose for which it was purchased.

We recommend the following appropriations for the necessary expenses for the current year:

By reason of resignations, sickness and transfers, the record of changes in teachers for this year is a long one. Early in the spring term Miss Williams was offered a position at an increase of salary, which she felt she should not decline. She was followed by Miss Katherine N. Bickford, whose record was such that at the close of the term she was elected to a position nearer her home, where she would have fewer subjects to teach and a larger salary than with us. As her successor, Miss Elizabeth A. Hazeltine was selected, and she in turn has yielded to the temptation of a larger salary and fewer subjects to teach, and will leave us at the end of January.

At the end of the spring term, Mr. Gleason closed eight years of efficient work as principal of the high school, and resigned to

accept a similar position in Ayer, a well earned promotion. From the numerous applicants, Mr. George W. Emerson was chosen as successor. Mr. Emerson's training, experience, and credentials were such that we had reason to expect that the school would continue to enjoy the good reputation it had won with the State Board of Education, and the College Examination Boards. At the close of the first term, however, Mr. Emerson resigned to accept an appointment as superintendent in a district in Connecticut, a line of work which he had long wished to enter. Mr. Lee S. Merrill, who follows him, shows a familiarity with the problems of a school and an ability to grasp them, which with his educational qualifications give promise of a very efficient administration.

At the close of the last school year Miss Bean, who shared her services as supervisor of drawing between our schools, and those of the town of Needham, was asked to give all her time to that town and accordingly resigned her position here. Miss Marjorie Brownell of Somerville, who was elected to the vacancy, like her predecessors in the position is a graduate of the Normal Art School, and comes to her work here with sound training joined to practical experience.

The latter part of the spring term Mrs. Browne was obliged to give up her work at the Rocky Nook Intermediate school for a time on account of her health, and Miss Mildred Roby, a graduate of the Newburyport Training School, was engaged to complete the term, which she did successfully. With the fall term Mrs. Browne returned to her school, but found that she had not fully recovered her strength, and was compelled to stay out again. Miss Daley was transferred from Silver Lake, her place there being taken for the remainder of the term by Miss Pen-cock, and now by Mrs. Browne, whose many friends unite in wishing for her a complete restoration to health.

During the summer Mrs. Fales resigned her position as teacher of the Grammar school to be married, and Miss Faunce was appointed her successor, while Miss Roby was chosen to fill the resulting vacancy in the Upper Primary school.

With the opening of the fall term it became evident that the Howland's Lane building was so crowded that even the expedient of holding half day sessions in the lower school would not provide the necessary relief. It was felt, too, that this district, perhaps, more than any other in town, needed the fullest advantages that could be offered as so large a proportion come to school handicapped by a lack of knowledge of the English language, and as so many are obliged to leave school early to go to work. After consideration of various plans the hall of the hose house was secured and furnished for thirty-five pupils, and the second grade pupils and enough from the third grade to make up the number, were organized as a separate school in charge of Miss Bates, while the Northwest school was closed, the few pupils belonging to Kingston, being furnished with transportation to the schools at the center of the town, and those of Pembroke going to Bryantville. While I believe this was the best arrangement that could be made with the means at the disposal of the committee, no one who is familiar with the conditions, can feel that it should be considered a solution of the difficulties. The room is so crowded, the lighting so poor, the heating facilities so inadequate, to say nothing of other conditions, that I feel that the necessity of making use of this building at this time should rouse the community to the appreciation of the urgent need of providing suitable accommodations for this rapidly growing part of the town.

Early in the spring nearly one hundred pupils of our schools received seed potatoes from the Massachusetts Agricultural College which they agreed to plant and care for in accordance with the suggestions of a pamphlet furnished with them. Notwithstanding the severe drought of the summer, a majority of the pupils persevered, and some very creditable reports of the experiment were turned in.

Arbor Day was observed by the planting of over two hundred catalpa trees which were furnished free to the pupils of our schools by the generosity of Gilchrist & Company of Boston.

The only condition imposed was that the child should have the permission of the parent to take the tree, and that he promised to care for the tree after planting. Inquiries in the fall showed that a very large proportion of the trees thus planted had lived, and were growing well.

At the last session of the General Court, an act was passed codifying the existing laws in regard to industrial and vocational education, and extending the scope of their application. Following are quotations relating to the organization of Agricultural Departments in existing high schools.

"Agricultural Education shall mean that form of vocational education which fits for the occupations connected with the tillage of the soil, the care of domestic animals, forestry and other wage-earning or productive work on the farm."

"Independent agricultural school shall mean either an organization of courses, pupils and teachers, under a distinctive management designed to give agricultural education, as hereinafter provided for, or a separate agricultural department, offering in a high school, as elective work, training in the principles and practice of agriculture to an extent, and of a character approved by the board of education as vocational."

"Attendance upon such day, or part-time classes shall be restricted to those over fourteen, and under twenty-five years of age."

"Any city or town may, through its school committee or through a board of trustees elected by the city or town to serve for a period not to exceed five years, and to be known as the local board of trustees for vocational education, establish and maintain independent . . . agricultural . . . schools."

"Independent agricultural schools shall, so long as they are approved by the board of education as to organization, control, location, equipment, courses of study, qualifications of teachers, methods of instruction, conditions of admission, employment of pupils and expenditures of money, constitute approved local or district independent vocational schools. Cities and towns main-

taining such approved local or district independent vocational schools shall receive reimbursement as provided in sections nine and ten of this act."

"The Commonwealth . . . shall pay annually to cities and towns maintaining approved independent agricultural schools consisting of other than agricultural departments in high schools an amount equal to one-half the sum to be known as the net maintenance sum." (This is the total amount expended for support less the amount received from tuition, sales, etc.)

"Cities and towns maintaining . . . approved agricultural departments in high schools shall be reimbursed to the extent of two-thirds of the salaries paid to the instructors in such agricultural departments."

In connection with the Agricultural Education Extension course, given in the Town Hall in October, under the auspices of the Village Club, Dr. Rufus W. Stimson, the agent of the State Board of Education, in charge of this work, explained the plans of the Board as to the organization of these schools. It was unfortunate that there was not a larger attendance of the town's people, and especially of parents of the large number of boys and girls who would be particularly benefited by the establishment of such a school.

Since the last report was written, the certificate privilege which our high school had enjoyed for several years past, has been renewed by the College Examination Board for another term of three years. This endorsement of the quality of the work of the school should be most gratifying to its friends, and should enlist the efforts of all to maintain a high standard of excellence.

In closing I wish to testify to the fidelity of the teachers in the discharge of their duties in their several positions which has made the year a profitable one for the schools notwithstanding the unfavorable circumstances to which I have referred in the earlier part of this report.

REPORT OF SCHOOL PHYSICIAN.

During the year 1911 the work of the School Physician has been carried on in a manner similar to that of previous years.

In this time twenty-five calls have been made, and a total of 871 examinations of pupils.

Twenty-one examinations were made of pupils presenting employment tickets, and the required certificate issued in each case.

Notice was sent to the parent or guardian, in each case where any diseased condition was found, stating the condition.

All pupils suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, have been promptly excluded from school, and a notice of such exclusion, stating the cause therefor, has been sent to the parent or guardian in each case.

As will be seen from this report, a much larger number of pupils have been excluded during the past year on account of pediculosis than for all other contagious or infectious diseases combined. This is a condition for which there can be no excuse, and is one which would soon cease to exist if parents would take reasonable care.

The following diseases or diseased conditions were found to exist:

- Decayed teeth, 346.
- Enlarged tonsils, 100.
- Impetigo contagiosa, 7.
- Pediculosis, 73.
- Purulent conjunctivitis, 13.
- Adenoids, 6.
