ANNUAL MARCH MEETING

In pursuance of a warrant duly served the inhabitants of the Town of Kingston qualified to vote in town affairs, met at their Town House on Saturday, the 2nd day of March, 1912, at 6.30 o'clock a. m. The meeting having been called to order by Henry S. Everson, Town Clerk, David C. Freeman was chosen moderator. The following officers were chosen by ballot:

Selectmen.—Albert E. Holmes, Walter H. Faunce, William J. O'Brien.

Town Clerk.—Henry S. Everson.

Assessor.—Albert E. Holmes.

Auditor.—Leinuel R. Ford.

Collector of Taxes.—Henry S. Everson.

Water Commissioner.—Charles H. Drew, 3 years.

Overseers of the Poor.—Albert E. Holmes, Walter H. Faunce, William J. O'Brien.

Highway Surveyor.—E. Elbridge Atwood.

Constables.—Wendell O. Chandler, Ephraim Pratt.

School Committee.—Fred G. Brackett, 3 years. Frank L. Chandler, 3 years.

Treasurer.—Henry S. Everson.

Trustees of Public Library.—John P. Farrington, 3 years. Arthur W. Pierce, 3 years. George W. Adams 1 year.

On the question, Shall license for the sale of intoxicating liquors be granted in this town, 125 voted yes, 149 no.

The meeting for the transaction of other business was opened at 2 o'clock p. m. The following persons were chosen to fill other offices and the following votes were passed:

Pound Keeper.—John H. Hathaway.

Field Driver.—Winfield R. Keene.

Surveyors of Lumber.—Stillman B. Small, George B. Holmes, M. Parker Delano.

Surveyors of Wood.—George B. Holmes, E. Elbridge Atwood.

Fish Committee.—Arthur B. Holmes, Michael Malone, George E. Cushman.

Town House Committee.—The Selectmen.

Fence Viewers.—Alexander Holmes, Carl C. Faunee, Nahum Sampson.

Voted. That the care of the Burying Ground be placed in the hands of the Tree Warden.

Voted. That no payment be made from the treasury except upon orders from the Selectmen or direct vote of the Town authorizing the same, and that no order upon the treasury shall be paid after the collector shall have received his warrant for the collections of taxes, until the person in whose favor the order is drawn shall have paid his tax.

Voted. That all taxes be paid on or before October 10th next, and the collector proceed and is instructed to collect by legal process all taxes unpaid after that date.

Voted. That interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum be charged on all unpaid taxes after the 10th of October next.

Voted. That the financial year of the town close December 31, 1912, and that the annual town meeting be held on the first Saturday in March, 1913 and be opened at 6.30 a. m.

Voted. That the report of town officers as printed be accepted.

Voted. That the town treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen be and hereby is authorized to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of taxes of the municipal year, beginning from January 1st, 1912, to an amount not exceeding in the aggregate \$12,000 and to issue a note or notes therefore payable within one year, any debt or debts incurred under this vote to be paid from the taxes of said municipal year.

Voted. That the town purchase a spraying machine, and the sum of \$500 be appropriated therefor.

Voted. That the town pay all charges for Moth work in the town, except what is paid by the Commonwealth, and the assessors be authorized to assess the required amount.

Voted. That the town purchase chemical extinguishers and equipment, to be used at forest fires and otherwise, and that the sum of \$250.00 be appropriated therefor, and the Forest Warden be instructed to purchase the same.

Voted. That the town accept the William H. Willis bequest and the Selectmen be authorized to invest the fund, and income to be used as provided in the will.

Voted. To postpone Art. 10 until after other appropriations are made.

Voted. To postpone Art. 10 indefinitely.

Voted. That the School Committee provide increased School accommodations at Rocky Nook.

Voted. That the treasurer be and hereby is authorized to borrow a sum not exceeding \$7500.00 for the purpose of paying the expense of a new school building at Rocky Nook and to issue therefore the notes of the Town each for the sum of \$1500.00 bearing interest at a rate not exceeding 4 1-2 per cent per annum payable semi-annually, dated June 1st, 1912 and payable one at the end of each year thereafter until all are paid. The said notes to be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by a majority of the Selectmen.

Voted. That the town accept the provisions of Chapter 57 of the Acts of 1912 relating to the time limit for claim grants.

Voted. To accept the provisions of Chapter 244 of the Acts of 1911 relating to fires in open air.

Voted. That the sum of \$100.00 be appropriated and paid to the executive committee of the K. F. D. towards paying the expenses of their twenty-fifth anniversary celebration on July 4th or some other date this coming summer that they may plan.

Voted. That the assessors be authorized to have printed in the annual report an itemized list of each parcel of Property, the assessed value of each and some proper method of identifying same, and appropriated the sum of \$150.00 for that purpose.

Voted. That the sums of \$210.89 and \$12.40 amounting to \$223.29 in the hands of the treasurer, the balance of two Water Loans, be placed in the General Town account.

Voted. That the appropriation for the Town House be \$500.00.

Voted. That the sum of \$10 be paid David C. Freeman for services as moderator.

211 feet of 4-incl iron pipe has been laid in Spring street, and an extension, 138 feet in length was made in Pembroke street during the year. Twenty-one new services were connected, 4 new hydrants were set, and many new service boxes and shut-offs in the water line, to replace worn out ones. One year ago it was thought that the dam at the Pumping station was too old and would not be worth repairing. A careful examination of it showed the principal timbers to be in much better condition than their appearance indicated. We have renewed the defective portions of the dam, and we now believe that with a reasonable amount of care and expense it will endure for many years. One electric motor in the Pumping Station, that had caused much trouble and expense, has been replaced with one of a new and improved type, and gears that had been expensive to maintain, if unsatisfactory, have been discarded. A silent chain is now used to their place, and is in every way a great improvement.

At the annual town meeting held on March 2nd, 1912, the School Committee was authorized to provide additional school accommodations at Rocky Nook, and the necessary money was appropriated therefor.

A lot containing one acre twenty rods, was purchased from the Seth Cobb estate. It will be seen that the lot is of sufficient size to provide a roomy playground, which is an extremely desirable feature, if not an absolute necessity.

Plans and estimates for the erection of a two room building were obtained, but owing to the rapidly increasing population in the southern part of the town, it was considered necessary to procure plans and request estimates for a four-room building.

A comparison of the estimates for the two types of buildings, clearly showed that a structure containing four rooms--the two upper rooms to be left unfinished--could be built at a comparatively small additional cost. A four room building was then decided upon. The advantage to the town by pursuing such a course can hardly be questioned.

Bids were invited. Upon the award being made, work on the foundation was begun. On account of favorable weather conditions, work has progressed very satisfactorily, so that the two lower rooms are now occupied. The two upper rooms, when needed, may be finished at little expense.

Two years ago the schools at Rocky Nook were so crowded that it was found necessary to establish a temporary school in the Hose house.

This year the crowded condition was so aggravated that additional room had to be provided, and so the Northwest school house was opened. This school is now closed, and the use of the Hose house has been discontinued.

The various school buildings are in good condition. During the past summer the building at Wapping has been painted, and the Howland's Lane building has been shingled.

A deficit is shown in the Committee's account, which is largely due to less money than was anticipated, having been received

from the State, dog fund, and for the tuition of non-resident pupils. On account of maintaining the Northwest school, the expense of transportation has been considerably more than in previous years.

The list of changes in teachers since the publication of the last report is as follows: Early in the winter term Miss Hazeltine resigned her position in the High School, and was succeeded by Miss Mabel F. Moore. Later in the term, Miss Haven asked for a leave of absence, her place being filled for the remainder of the year by Miss Marion D. Brooks. Early in the spring term, Miss Faulkner, after a long and successful service as teacher of the lower grades of the Center Primary school, resigned on account of her approaching marriage. This vacancy was filled by the transfer of Miss Bryant from Stony Brook, and this in turn by the transfer of Miss Grace from Wapping, where she was succeeded by Miss Eva L. Whitecomb, a graduate of the Fitchburg Normal school. During the summer vacation, Miss Haven, Miss Moore, and Miss Holmes, accepted positions at larger salaries.

than we could pay, and the resulting vacancies were filled by the choice of Miss Lacy E. Treat, a graduate of Colby College, who had had successful experience in High School work, Miss Adela MacMillan, a recent graduate of Boston University, and Miss Olive F. Johnson, a graduate of the department for the Training of Commercial teachers of the Salem Normal school.

As the time for opening the fall term approached, it became evident that the number of pupils in the grades above the fourth was too large to be accommodated as had heretofore been done by transporting the eighth grade to the center of the town, leaving a school consisting of the fifth, sixth, and seventh grades. Accordingly it was decided to divide the school, and open another room, Miss Marston being put in charge of the seventh and eighth grades, and Miss Daley of the fifth and sixth, and that until the new school house should be ready for occupancy the higher school should be transported to the vacant building at Northwest Kingston. Fortunately the weather thus far has been very favorable for the carrying out of this arrangement, and, while it must have caused more or less inconvenience in the domestic arrangements of some of the families affected, pupils and parents alike have been very kind in making the best of the situation. To fill the vacancy caused by the transfer of Miss Daley, Miss Grace R. O'Neil, also a graduate of the Salem Normal school, was selected.

Probably the event of the greatest importance of the year is the erection of the new school house at Rocky Nook. This building, begun after much unavoidable delay, and now nearly ready for occupancy, should with the rooms already available, provide accommodations for that section for a long time to come. The large lot of land in connection with the building, should be of great value for school purposes, as well as for use for a public playground in that section, where so large a proportion of the children have no other place but the street for their games.

Although as is shown by the table of Membership and Attendance, our schools secured a high percentage of attendance for

the past year, there still remains a large amount of absent, for which there is no reasonable excuse, while there is an amount of tardiness which is astonishing in the aggregate. Efforts on the part of the teachers to secure the co-operation of the parents in remedying this condition have not met with the degree of success which they have deserved. Of course the whole question comes back to the parent's point of view of the importance of regularity of attendance and punctuality. The attitude of the framers of the law is very definite. All children between the ages of seven and fourteen, whose physical or mental condition does not prevent, shall attend school all the time that it is in session, and provision for punishment is made in the case of parents who permit more than a specified amount of absence. Provision is made however, for the excusing of necessary absence, thus opening the door to another flood of disagreeable duties for the poor teacher, and as a result, in many cases, almost completely nullifying the law. Personally I believe that if the parent could be made to realize the effect of irregularity of attendance upon the pupil, not merely upon his chances for promotion from grade to grade, but still more upon the character which he is forming, the question would be largely settled. If they realize that prospective employers inquire no less insistently about the habits formed in school than concerning the class standing, although there is usually a connection between these, they would appreciate that the possession of these virtues has a definite and real value which may sometimes almost be estimated in terms of dollars and cents.

With the beginning of the fall term, certain minor changes in the courses of study of the High School were made, in line with those begun the previous year, for the purpose of better meeting the demands of the preparation for higher institutions. The Commercial Course still maintains its popularity, and is proving its adequacy for preparing those who are willing to make the necessary effort, to fill and hold good positions in the business world. It is to be regretted that so large a proportion seem to

the High school, with no definite purpose in view, and frequently select courses which they find later ill adapted to their plans for life. This is particularly true of many who late in their High School course decide to enter college or normal or technical schools. Better preparation in less time, and with less effort usually follows an early decision.

I think it is fitting that I should refer in this report to the long and faithful service of the late H. Waldo Foster, as janitor of the schools at the center of the town. My association with him for nine years gave me opportunity to appreciate at its true value his sterling worth, and I esteem it a privilege to offer this tribute to his memory.

In closing I wish to express my gratification at the pleasant relations that have so generally existed between the different departments of the school administration and the community, which have contributed so largely, with the fidelity of those engaged in instruction, to make the year the successful one that it has been.

REPORT OF SCHOOL PHYSICIAN

During the year 1912, the School Physician has made twenty-two calls and 621 individual examinations of pupils. The usual notices have been sent in all cases where any diseased condition was found to exist.

Twenty-five examinations were made of pupils presenting employment tickets, and the required certificate issued.

The most marked feature of the work for the year was the decreased number of cases of Pediculosis, there being but eight cases as against seventy-three cases the year previous.

The following diseases, or diseased conditions, were found to exist:

- Impetigo Contagiosa, 3.
- Pedientosis, 8.
- Adenoids, 9.
