March 15, 1947.

Article 6. On the motion of George W. Cushman, Voted: That the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, be and hereby is authorized to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning January 1, 1947, and to issue a note or notes therefor, payable within one year and to renew any note or notes

as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with Section 17, Chapter 44, General Laws.

Article 7. On the motion of Orfeo H. Sgarzi, Voted: That the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for the purpose of maintaining during the ensuing year the mosquito control work as estimated and certified to by the State Reclamation Board in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 112, Acts of 1931.

Article 8. On the motion of John J. Moore, Voted: That the sum of \$4,700 be raised and appropriated to meet the town's share of the cost of Chapter 90 Highway Construction, and that, in addition, permission be given the Selectmen to transfer unappropriated available funds in the treasury to meet the State's and County's shares of the cost of the work, the reimbursements from the State and County to be restored, upon their receipt, to unappropriated available funds in the treasury.

Article 9. On the motion of Percy W. Bailey, Voted: That the sum of \$2,300 be raised and appropriated for the purchase of a 1½ ton truck for the Highway Department, and authorize the Selectmen to turn in the 1½ ton truck now owned by the Highway Department and apply the allowance thereof to the purchase price of a new truck.

Article 10. On the motion of Orfeo H. Sgarzi, Voted: That the sum of \$1,200 be raised and appropriated for the purchase of a ½ ton truck for the Highway Department.

Article 11. On the motion of John J. Moore, Voted: That the sum of \$650 be raised and appropriated for the purchase of a sand-spreader for the Highway Department.

Article 12. John J. Moore moved that the sum of \$1500 be raised and appropriated for the purpose of painting and repairing the Town House. MOTION WAS NOT CARRIED. (Yes—37; No—140)

Article 13. On the motion of Ernest H. Cote, Voted: That the unexpended balance of \$150.21 now in the appropriation made at the annual town meeting, March 1942 for the driveway at High School be transferred to High and Maple Avenue Schools—Grounds and Playgrounds.

Article 14. On the motion of Ernest H. Cote, Voted: That the sum of \$2,500 be raised and appropriated for the purpose of repairing the High School roof.

Article 15. On the motion of Mitchell Toabe, Voted: That the town continue the School Building Committee, consisting of the School Committee, one member appointed by the Selectmen, two members appointed by the Finance Committee, and one member appointed by the Moderator for the purpose of employing an architect to draw up plans and specifications for a new school or school buildings, and to authorize said committee to apply for an advance of funds from the Federal Works Agency to be used for architects fees.

Article 16. On the motion of Mitchell Toabe, Voted: That the sum of \$5,000.57 be transferred from the Sale of Tax Possession Funds and the sum of \$1,000 of free and unappropriated cash be appropriated for the purpose of purchasing the following lots of land for school purposes: a portion of the so-called Quinn Estate on Main Street described as follows: a strip of land about 200 feet in width running parallel and adjacent to the property of Harry Tilton from Main Street to First Brook, and to include the remainder of the Quinn property beyond the brook, containing approximately 16 acres shown as Lot No. 2, Blocks No. 10 and No. 11 on the Assessors' maps; and a portion of the property of Eugenia and Mary Trow about 360 feet wide and 475 feet long containing approximately 3½ acres and running southwest from the property of Harry Tilton, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to make the purchase. The vote was: Yes—252; No—5.

Article 17. Percy W. Bailey moved that the way known as River View Avenue extending northerly from Main Street be accepted as a Town Way, to be known as River View Avenue, and as laid out by the Selectmen and shown on a plan filed with the Town Clerk on March 4, 1947, together with a layout thereof.

Karl Reidenbach moved that no action be taken on this article. AMENDMENT WAS CARRIED. Therefore, no action was taken on Article 17.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote that the way known as Center Hill Road be accepted as a town way as laid out by the Selectmen, in accordance with the General Laws.

On the motion of Karl Reidenbach, Voted: That no action be taken on this article.

On the motion of Ernest H. Cote, Voted: That Article 28 be acted on next, following Article 18. (Yes—155, No—72)

Article 28. John Golden moved that the sum of \$90,000 be raised and appropriated for the purpose of extending the water main, not less than eight inches in diameter, from the junction of Pembroke and Brookdale Streets to the corner of Pembroke and Lake Streets, thence through Lake Street to the railroad crossing, thence along Grove Street to property assessed to Ruby Hales, a distance of approximately 20,000 feet, and to meet said appropriation the treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, be and hereby is authorized to borrow \$90,000, and issue notes or bonds of the town therefor, payable in not more than fifteen years, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 44, General Laws.

After a lengthy discussion, a vote was taken on Article 28, and it was not carried. (Yes—97, No—144).

Before a motion was made under Article 28 Mr. John E. Wright moved that Article 28 be laid on the table. This motion was lost. (Yes—108, No—122).

On the motion of John J. Moore, Voted: To adjourn this meeting until Thursday, March 20, 1947 at 7:30 P. M. at the Reed Community Building.

There were 354 voters present—men, 223; women—131.

March 20, 1947

The adjourned meeting was called to order by the Moderator Albert H. Holmes, at 7:35 P. M.

Article 19. On the motion of Walter Richter, Voted: That the way known as Shirley Avenue extending southerly from Main Street adjoining land of Edgar G. and Mary G. White, be accepted as a Town Way, to be known as Shirley Avenue, and as laid out by the Selectmen and shown on a plan filed with the Town Clerk on March 4, 1947, together with a layout thereof, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$750 for the construction thereof.

Richard W. O'Brien moved to reconsider Article 28, which was acted on at last Saturday's meeting. Mr. O'Brien informed the meeting that he had voted against Article 28.

Mr. Horace C. Weston moved an amendment to reconsider Article 28 following Article 33. AMENDMENT CARRIED. A vote was taken on the original motion, as amended, that Article 28 be reconsidered following Article 33. MOTION WAS LOST.

Harold F. Battles moved to reconsider Article 12. Mr. Battles informed the voters that he had voted against this Article last Saturday. MOTION NOT CARRIED.

Article 20. On the motion of John J. Moore, Voted unanimously: That the Selectmen be authorized to sell the Rocky Nook Schoolhouse to the American Legion, Harold F. Govoni Post, No. 387 for the sum of \$1.00, subject to the condition that when the property is no longer used for Legion quarters it shall revert to the town.

Article 21. On the motion of Percy W. Bailey, Voted: That the Selectmen be authorized to dispose of the property (land and building thereon) known as the Hose House on Main Street.

Article 22. On the motion of Orfeo H. Sgarzi, Voted unanimously: That \$57 be raised and appropriated to pay an unpaid 1945 bill of the Health Department.

Article 23. On the motion of Ralph F. Santoro, Voted: That the sum of \$850 be raised and appropriated for the purpose of purchasing a truck for the Water Department and that the Water Commissioners be authorized to turn in the truck now owned by the Water Department and apply the allowance thereof to the purchase price of a new truck.

Article 24. Ralph F. Santoro moved: That the sum of \$5,000 be appropriated and transferred from available funds now in the treasury for the purpose of extending the water main on River View Avenue, approximately 1700 feet of 6" pipe and approximately 50 feet of 10" pipe. No pipe to be laid until such time as at least six (6) dwellings are in the process of erection.

John E. Wright moved an amendment that action be postponed on Article 24 until six houses are actually built.

Jennie E. Taylor moved that Article 24 be laid on the table. The Moderator appointed the following tellers: John B. West, Karl F. Anderson, Melbourn P. Merry, Charles W. Lawrence.

A vote was taken on Mrs. Taylor's motion, and it was carried. Yes—135; No—116; therefore, Article 24 was laid on the table.

Article 25. On the motion of Ralph F. Santoro, Voted: That the sum of \$300 be raised and appropriated for the purpose of extending approximately 500 feet of 2" pipe along Sunset Avenue, so-called.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of replacing the present 4" water main with an 8" water main, starting on Summer Street at the junction of Summer and Main Street to Green Street, a distance of approximately 1700 feet.

No motion was made under this article.

Article 27. On the motion of Ralph F. Santoro, Voted: That the sum of \$200 be raised and appropriated for the purpose of locating the bounds on property of the Kingston Water Department.

John E. Wright moved that Article 32 be taken up at this time, and out of order. MOTION NOT CARRIED.

Article 29. John E. Wright moved that action on this article be indefinitely postponed. MOTION NOT CARRIED.

Remido Tassinari moved that the sum of \$15,000 be raised and appropriated for the purpose of extending the water main not less than eight inches in diameter from the junction of Route 3 and 3A to a point about fifty feet beyond property assessed to Abbie Randall, and on Tarkiln Road to the Kingston-Duxbury line, or approximately 3613 feet.

John J. Moore moved an amendment that no work shall be started on this project until such time as satisfactory information is obtained from the state engineers as to what they propose to do in regard to the bypass. AMENDMENT WAS CARRIED. Yes—113; No—112.

Then a vote was taken on the original motion as amended, and it was voted: That the sum of \$15,000 be raised and appropriated for the purpose of extending the water main not less than eight inches in diameter from the junction of Route 3 and 3A to a point about fifty feet beyond property assessed to Abbie Randall, and on Tarkiln Road to the Kingston-Duxbury line, or approximately 3643 feet, and that no work shall be started on this project until such time as satisfactory information is obtained from the state engineers as to what they propose to do in regard to the bypass.

Article 30. Merle F. Peterson moved: That the town raise and appropriate \$5,000 for the purpose of extending the water main approximately 1,650 feet, from Brook Street to property of Merle F. Peterson on Second Brook. MOTION WAS NOT CARRIED.

Article 31. John King moved: That the town raise and appropriate \$3,000 for the purpose of extending the 8" water main from the present main on Grove Street to property assessed to Jennie Deans, a distance of approximately 300 feet.

Richard R. Gessner moved an amendment that the distance be 800 feet instead of 300 feet. As the article called for 300 feet, this was ruled out of order by the Moderator, and his ruling was sustained by the voters.

Ralph F. Santoro moved an amendment that the amount be changed to \$1200, instead of \$3,000.

Horace C. Weston moved that action under Article 31 be indefinitely postponed. MOTION WAS CARRIED. Therefore, no action was taken.

Article 32. On the motion of Irma A. Ruffini, Voted: That the following appropriation balances be closed out to Surplus Revenue:

New Fire Truck	221.00

Elliot B. Verney moved that Article 24 be taken from the table. MOTION WAS NOT CARRIED.

Article 33. On the motion of Arnold Facchini, Voted: That \$10,000 of free and unappropriated cash be appropriated to the use of the Assessors, if available at the time of fixing the tax rate and approved by the Commissioner of Corporations and Taxation as available funds, under the authority of Section 23, of Chapter 59 of the General Laws.

On the motion of Fred L. Bailey, Voted: To adjourn (9:35 P. M.). Vote checkers were Catherine J. Bartlett and Paul E. Tobin. Number of voters present—329 (202 men and 127 women).

Before a vote was taken on the above article Horace C. Weston moved for an adjournment. This motion was lost—yes—68; no—72. After further discussion Harold J. Weston moved for indefinite postponement. This motion was lost—yes 68; no—73. The vote on article 1 was yes—74; no—66.

Article 2. On the motion of Lincoln C. Bartlett, Voted: That the sum of \$600 of free and unappropriated cash be appropriated for the purpose of extending an 8" water main from Pembroke Street along Winter Street for a distance of approximately 300 feet. (Voted unanimously)

No pipe is to be laid until such time as at least (6) dwellings are in the process of erection.

That portion of the land of Teresa M. Warrener on Main Street containing 18.32 acres and shown on plan entitled: 'Plan of Portion of Land of Teresa M. Warrener and a Portion of Land of Mary L. and Eugenia B. Trow, Kingston, Mass., Scale 1 in. = 80 ft., July 7, 1947, Delano and Keith Surveyors', and that portion of the land of Eugenia B. Trow

containing 4.14 acres and shown on said plan as the Trow Lot; and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to purchase the same subject to such rights and encumbrances as said Board may approve.

Article 5. On the motion of A. Bradshaw Bonney, Voted: That the Selectmen are hereby instructed to sell the property on Main Street on which the Hose House is located, to the Kingston Post 108, American Legion, Inc., for the sum of \$1 on the condition that when this land is no longer used for Legion purposes it shall revert to the Town.

On the motion of John J. Moore, Voted: To adjourn at 9:16 P. M.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

During the past year the services rendered under our jurisdiction were performed in a more normal and satisfactory atmosphere than had been possible in the previous trouble-some years. Nevertheless, the national inflationary conditions have of necessity affected our own municipal costs.

With the advent of considerable new home construction within our borders, the demands for additional service increases, and by furnishing these services the town will thereby encourage others to build among us also.

On authority given to us by the voters we have purchased for school purposes a portion of the Quinn property (18.32 acres) and a portion of the Trow property (4.14 acres). Both parcels have been surveyed, bounds have been set and a Land Court Title is in the process of being procured.

Considerable progress has been made in the furtherance of our Chapter 90 road-building program, with additional work having been done on both Evergreen and Pembroke Streets. Splendid co-operation has been shown by our County Commissioners and the State Department of Public Works, so that the future aspects of this program look very promising.

The new equipment which was purchased for the highway department has proven highly satisfactory and helps immeasurably in obtaining better results in every way.

We humbly ask your forgiveness for the unsatisfactory way in which the removal of snow from sidewalks and the mowing of grass along our highways has been handled. We lack equipment of our own to do this necessary work and have

not been too successful in hiring others to do it. We therefore plan to ask the voters to appropriate the necessary funds for the purchase of a combination sidewalk plow, mowing machine and rotary brush.

The 1941 1½ ton highway truck should be replaced by the purchase of a new truck and a request will be made at the annual town meeting for this purpose.

As we reported to you previously the Town House is in need of re-painting and steps should be taken to preserve this building.

The co-operation between the various departments has been splendid throughout the year.

REPORT OF INSPECTOR OF ANIMALS AND INSPECTOR OF SLAUGHTERING

Honorable Board of Selectmen:

Gentlemen:

This past year there were fifty-nine loads of cattle shipped into Kingston from New Hampshire, Vermont and Canada, consisting of six hundred and thirty-five cows and six bulls.

These animals were all inspected and found to be free

of disease. Reports of these inspections were forwarded to the State Division of Livestock Disease Control.

Thirteen dogs were quarantined on suspicion of rabies but all were released after fourteen days confinement. One dog, which was brought into this state illegally, was quarantined for ninety days.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

During 1947 the Forest Fire Department answered one hundred twenty-four calls; of these, ninety were for grass and woods, three railroad fires, ten out-of-town calls, seventeen at the town dump, and four stand-by calls.

After such a hard year there is very little left of our mobile equipment. At the present time we have but one piece that is safe to rely upon; therefore, this Department is inserting an article in the coming warrant for a new truck for Forest Fire work.

I would like at this time to thank the citizens of Kingston for their co-operation in adhering so well to the state laws regarding permits to have fires in the open. During the period from January 1, 1947 to December 31, 1947, 2026 such permits were granted, 344 in person and 1682 by telephone.

REPORT OF THE SHELLFISH CONSTABLE

To the Honorable Board of Selectmen:

During 1947 there was comparatively little activity in the shellfish industry. It was again a very poor year in the natural propagation and growing of clams.

There was a reasonable supply of Quahogs and it is estimated that above 200 bushels were taken. On two occasions during the summer, quahog seed was planted, in all forty-five bushels. These were of small size, about 4000 to the bushel. This seed came from other areas and was purchased with the co-operation of the Bureau of Marine Fisheries of the Dept. of Conservation. I recommend an appropriation, at least equal to last year's for the planting of quahog seed during 1948.

Sea worms continue to be an item of considerable revenue to our diggers and I estimate well over \$2000 worth were taken during the year.

Family diggers permits issued—180—no charge.

Estimated revenue to our diggers from all sources—\$3,441.00.

REPORT OF THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

In the 1946 report to the town, your Highway Department stated that a good start had been made in reclaiming some of our roads that were so badly neglected during the war years, and we are now in a position to say the same standard was upheld in 1947.

A portion of Prospect Street and a section of Indian Pond Road were reshaped and laid down with an asphalt binder. Maple Street, on which we had planned to apply a seal coat, was so deteriorated it was deemed advisable to change the plans and apply what is called the mixed-in-place type of construction. This consists of two inches of gravel, grader-mixed, with asphalt, and spread to the desired thickness. Brookdale Street received an asphalt and sand seal, and several other roads received preliminary work preparatory to the 1948 program.

Our Chapter 90 work during 1947 consisted of the completion of the sections of Evergreen and Pembroke Streets where the base work had been laid the previous year. The finish surface on these two streets is of Type I Bituminous Concrete, machine laid.

The major portion of the sidewalk program also centered on Evergreen Street, where 1700 feet of Bituminous Concrete sidewalks were laid.

The Highway Department is submitting articles in the warrant for a dump truck and a small tractor equipped with a rotary broom, sidewalk plow and a cutter bar for mowing the grass on our road shoulders.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH

We are again happy to report that the good health record achieved by our town in 1946 continued through 1947. This could not have been accomplished without the interest and co-operation of the townspeople at large and for that effort this department is extremely grateful. We also wish to thank Mrs. Helen L. Peterson, School Nurse, whose prompt and intelligent action has done much to correct situations which might lead to future health problems.

During 1947 we established a working agreement with the Plymouth Community Nurse Association whereby calls to Kingston residents would be made by that organization and we would reimburse them for calls when the recipient is unable to pay. This, of course, excludes those cases under Public Welfare or Old Age Assistance.

In co-operation with the State Department of Public Health, a survey of the eating and drinking establishments, including the public schools, was made during October. Although the percentage of 73.9% was considered good for a first check, we know that with the proper co-operation in carrying out the recommendations made, this percentage will be materially increased. A second survey is planned for 1948.

The public dump is now open every day and we have accordingly increased the amount of hours of work for the care-taker. This has worked out well, not only from the standpoint of public convenience, but also by increasing the amount of tonnage dumped and a corresponding decrease in rubbish deposited along our highways.

We regret the passing of Percy H. Holman on May 25, 1947, our faithful care-taker at the dump for many years. The

cheerful, friendly and kindly service rendered by him will be remembered by us for a long time. He was a true public servant.

REPORT OF PLAYGROUND COMMISSION

We present herewith the annual report of the Playground Commission to the citizens of Kingston.

The ball-field and tennis courts were graded and rolled again this year as in previous years, and the bank cleared. The ball-field was used extensively by the High School and Legion teams, and the tennis courts were also used very much. During the fall months the lower end of the field was used for the girls field hockey and High School football.

Additions were made to the field including an out-door basket-ball court and a soft-ball field. New swings and seesaws have been purchased and will be erected this Spring at the foot of the tennis courts. It is our plan to set this area aside for a children's playground, and in the future we hope to purchase additional children's playground equipment.

The community building is still used to a great extent, there having been two hundred and twenty-three free rentals and twenty-eight paid rentals during the year.

The shower baths were open daily from 2:30 P.M. to 5:30 P.M. for 314 days during the year and were very well patronized.

The voters of Kingston favored us with an appropriation last year to re-shingle the roof, which has been taken care of. This year we are asking for an appropriation of \$1900.00 to take down the fence surrounding the Playground property, re-galvanize it by the hot-dipped process, re-stretch and replace same. We feel that it should be done this year as it has never been re-galvanized since being erected twenty-two years ago. Therefore, we ask the voters of Kingston to favor us with the necessary appropriation.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE PLYMOUTH COUNTY EXTENSION SERVICE

One of the big contributions that the Plymouth County Extension Service made to the local Dairymen, during the past year was the artificial breeding program. The meeting held recently in Halifax for Poultrymen, was most helpful, especially the panel discussion on the control of respiratory diseases. Newcastle disease among poultry flocks, has reached almost epidemic proportions in New England, and information on control measures was most timely. Programs in near-

by towns have been conducted on a commodity basis for dairy men, poultrymen, fruit growers, market gardeners, cranberry growers and other smaller groups.

The County Extension Service again co-operated with the Plymouth County Agricultural Conservation Association, and a meeting was held at the Reed Community Building, at which nearly everyone present signed up for lime, super phosphates and cover crops and their many problems were thrashed out.

Three food buying conferences were held in Kingston, and the classes in furniture refinishing held in Plympton, were attended by local women.

Bulletins on food preservation, by canning, freezing and storage were sent to all on the mailing list, as was also an adult reading program. A slip cover demonstration was held here and home visits made to those who were having trouble finishing their work. Plans are nearing completion for a sewing project on the leader training basis, at a center easily accessible to Kingston, in the early spring.

PROJECTS

During 1947 the following projects were completed: Brookdale Street, Kennedy Road, Kingston Shores, Sunset Avenue.

We were delayed in starting Summer Street, Pembroke Street (from the railroad bridge to Ganquier's), and Winter Street, due to the fact that we were unable to obtain the pipe.

The water tank on Smith's Lane should be treated inside and outside this coming year, at a cost of about \$2,750, and some repairs should be made to the old reservoir. To cover the cost of doing this work we recommend the transfer of several unexpended balances, as follows: Brookdale Street—\$2,024.72; Pembroke Street (1945)—\$15.93; Kennedy Road

—\$528.02; Kingston Shores — \$425.42; Sunset Avenue — \$2.47; Pick-up Truck—\$13.50.

We are inserting an article in the warrant to replace the 4" main on Spring Street with a 6" main, in anticipation of the changes in our layout that will take place in this area due to the proposed construction of the Kingston by-pass.

Last spring we purchased a Dodge pick-up truck at a cost of \$836.50. This has proven to be a very satisfactory piece of equipment.

The Diesel engine was in operation during the year and gave us a superlative performance.

PARTIAL REPORT OF THE KINGSTON SCHOOL BUILDING COMMITTEE

The erection of a successful school building is the final step in a well-planned, carefully carried-out program. Your committee has followed such a program, and is continuing to give every step, its careful consideration.

The first step, the study of our school buildings and the resulting report, "Planning a Schoolhouse for To-morrow's Citizens", was followed by the next decisive step, purchase of the First Brook School Site.

At the last annual meeting, we were authorized to apply to the Federal Works Agency for a loan to defray architects' fees. Your committee was granted \$9200.00 for this purpose, and has received \$4600.00 from the Federal Government. This sum is deposited with the Town Treasurer, and the balance will be paid to the Town at the completion of the working drawings.

The committee interviewed a number of architects, and were unanimous in selecting Walter F. Bogner, and associate, to draw plans for a twelve room elementary school building to house grades one through six; to contain cafeteria, administration offices, etc. Dr. Bogner was a member of the group that surveyed our school buildings. The plans are to be prepared in such a manner that future additions could be added to this first unit.

The preparation of plans will take considerable time, and we will present them to the townspeople at public meetings during 1948, so that everyone will have an opportunity to watch its progress. No appropriation for building will be

requested until such time as there is a reasonable flow of materials; and that will not be before the annual meeting of 1949.

The committee is participating in the investigation of a Regional High School, and the results of this investigation will influence the final decision of our recommendation on whether or not our High School Students are to be housed in Kingston. Your attention is called to the School Committee report on the Old Colony Regional High School Committee.

We are requesting the appropriation of a sum of money to defray the necessary expenses of the committee.

Sir:

As directed by you, I have made an audit of the books and accounts of the town of Kingston for the year ending December 31, 1947, and report thereon as follows:

The financial transactions, as recorded on the books of the several departments receiving or disbursing money for the town or committing bills for collection, were examined and checked.

The books and accounts of the town accountant were examined. The receipts, as recorded, were checked with the treasurer's books and with the records of the several departments collecting money for the town, while the payments were checked with the treasury warrants and with the books of the treasurer.

The appropriations, as listed from the town clerk's records of town meetings, as well as the transfers from the reserve fund authorized by the finance committee, were checked to the accountant's ledger. The ledger accounts were analyzed, the necessary adjusting entries were made, and a balance sheet, which is appended to this report, was prepared showing the financial condition of the town as of December 31, 1947.

The balance sheet shows an overdraft of \$13,537.54 in the Chapter 90 highway construction account carried on by the town in conjunction with the State and county, which overdraft could have been avoided if the treasurer had issued a temporary loan in anticipation of reimbursement from the State and county, in accordance with Section 6A, Chapter 44, General Laws. If the town wishes to avoid borrowing for this purpose, the town meeting may appropriate from surplus revenue, in addition to the amount required to be provided as the town's share of the cost of the work, the amounts of the State and county allotments for highway work with the stipulation that the State and county reimbursements, when received, be credited back to surplus revenue.

The books and accounts of the treasurer were examined and checked. The receipts as recorded were analyzed and

checked with the records of the several departments collecting money for the town and with other sources from which money was paid into the town treasury, while the payments were compared with the selectmen's warrants authorizing the treasurer to disburse town funds. The cash book additions were verified, and the cash balance on January 17, 1948 was proved by actual count of the cash in the office and by reconciliation of the bank balance with a statement furnished by the bank of deposit.

The payments made on account of maturing debt and interest were compared with the cancelled securities on file and with the amounts falling due.

The savings bank books and securities representing the investment of the several trust and investment funds in the custody of the town treasurer and the trustees were examined and listed. The income was proved, the transfers to the town were compared with the treasurer's cash book, and all other transactions were verified.

The records of tax titles and tax possessions held by the town were examined and checked. The reported redemptions and sales of tax possessions were compared with the treasurer's receipts, and the tax titles and tax possessions on hand were listed and reconciled with the accountant's ledger.

The books and accounts of the town collector were examined and checked. The tax, excise, departmental, and water accounts outstanding at the time of the previous examination and all subsequent commitment lists were audited and compared with the warrants issued for their collection. The payments to the treasurer were verified, the recorded abatements were checked with the records in the departments authorized to grant such credits, and the outstanding accounts were listed and reconciled with the accountant's ledger.

The outstanding accounts were verified by mailing notices to a number of persons whose names appeared on the books as owing money to the town, the replies received thereto indicating that the accounts, as listed are correct.

The records of licenses and permits issued by the selectmen, the town clerk, and the health department were examined and checked, and the payments to the State and to the town were verified.

The surety bonds of the several officials required to furnish a bond for the faithful performance of their duties were examined and found to be in proper form.

In addition to the departments mentioned, the records of all other departments collecting money for the town were examined and checked in detail.

There are appended to this report, in addition to the balance sheet, tables showing a reconciliation of the treasurer's cash, summaries of the tax, excise, tax title, departmental, and water accounts, together with tables showing the condition and transactions of the trust and investment funds.

For the cooperation extended by the several town officials during the progress of the audit, I wish, on behalf of my assistants and for myself, to express appreciation.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT

1947

SCHOOL COMMITTEE

Herewith is presented the annual report of the School Department for the fiscal year 1947, the 222nd year of public schools in Kingston, together with the report of the Administrative Staff. The Committee wishes to thank the School Department Staff, the Principals and Superintendent, the various Town Officers, and all townspeople who have so generously assisted the Committee this year.

On March 8, Mrs. Ruth H. Bailey retired after a quarter century of continuous membership on the Committee; a testimonial banquet was tendered Mrs. Bailey in recognition of her long service to the children of the community.

Mr. Horace C. Weston, former Chairman of the Board of Selectmen and the School Committee, was elected to the Committee at the annual town election in March. Miss Norma P. Villani, graduate of Kingston High School 1943, was appointed Clerk of the School Department.

The pupil transportation contract was awarded to the only bidder for one year, the Plymouth and Brockton Street Railway Co., at a cost of \$28.00 per day, an increase of \$7.00 over the bid in 1944. Bus service was extended to Tremont Street and Brookdale Street. A complete bus schedule survey was made in December, and several needed changes authorized.

In April, the School Lunch Program was set up as an independent function under the jurisdiction of the Committee.

Mr. Francis M. Moran was appointed School Lunch Administrator.

An article is inserted in the next town warrant requesting Athletic Insurance for students engaged in sports, and "provides coverage while playing or practicing the games in which students are scheduled to compete". The limit per claim on account of any one student is \$500; the cost to the town is \$175 for 150 students.

The Committee is a member of the Old Colony Regional High School Committee composed of appointees of the School Committees in the towns of Duxbury, Halifax, Hanover, Hanson, Marshfield, Norwell, Pembroke, and Plympton. This group has been asked to search and investigate the possibilities of, and to take preliminary steps toward the establishment of regional high school planning in this area. As a result of their efforts, "An Act for the Creation of an Old Colony High School District Planning Committee" has been filed in the State Legislature, under their petition, to enable four or more towns to take the first steps in the project. This act enables the appointees of the Boards of Selectmen, Finance Committees or Planning Boards, and School Committees of these towns to thoroughly study and make preliminary plans for a regional high school at a reasonable cost before making permanent commitments to the various town meetings.

Next September (1948), the number of rooms for grades 1-6 must be increased from 8 to 9 rooms as follows: grades 1, 2, and 5 require two rooms each, and grades 3, 4, and 6 require one room each. An article is inserted in the annual town warrant for the purpose of establishing this room.

Prices continue to rise: cost of books, supplies and equipment have soared to new levels, charges for skilled labor for maintenance work have increased over last year, and the sal-

aries of beginning teachers are at higher scales. The requested budget for 1948 is \$81,000.00, an increase of \$2,941.23 over the 1947 budget.

Your attention is called to the report of the Kingston School Building Committee. This Committee is working diligently on the school building program. Broad plans have been established, the school location is purchased, and the architect is working on the plans. The success of this program rests solely on the desire of the townspeople for school progress in the future. The cooperation and participation of the citizens at public meetings called to develop this program is of utmost importance.

Enrollment in Kingston High School seems to be holding its own in the face of rising enrollments at the elementary school level. It is expected that next year's figures will be up at least 10 per cent over this year, and the following year, an additional 5 per cent. When these increases reach the upper grades the problem will become more acute. For the purposes of this report it is necessary only to recognize the trend and plan accordingly.

The past year at Kingston High School has seen the continuation of the philosophy that the primary purpose of the American High School is to produce an informed, capable and co-operative citizen who recognizes his obligations to society.

Personnel—When school opened in September 1947, there were two new members of the faculty. Mr. Bruce Smith replaced Mr. Joseph Ortman and Mr. Donald Fitzpatrick replaced Mr. Borah Kreimer in the shop. Mr. Ortman resigned to accept a position in the Stoneham High School and Mr. Kreimer moved to Bridgewater Junior High School.

Curriculum Changes—Pursuing the aim of providing a comprehensive program of general education a new half year course entitled "Practical Business Law" has been added to our curriculum in the Senior year. This new addition was made possible by reducing the Office Practice Course from a full year to a half-year course. This new addition is more practical than its title implies and should provide our graduates with that knowledge necessary to cope with the simpler legal problems which the average citizen meets in his everyday contact with the business world. This course is closely allied with our courses in Consumer's Economics and General Mathematics added last year.

Activities—To adequately describe the many activities carried on by the students and teachers during the year would take more space than conditions allow. Perhaps a mere enumeration of the highlights will partially give these organizations the credit that is due them.

The highly successful operetta "The Belle of Bagdad" under the direction of Mr. Reynolds.

The three issues of the school publication, The Independence, under the direction of Miss Oliver and Mr. Ortman.

A new organization, the Kingston High School Athletic Association, to help raise funds for athletics.

A most successful Magazine Drive which realized a total of \$316.53 for the Activity Fund.

The "Care" program for the relief of stricken Europeans. The continued active support of the Student Council and the National Honor Society.

Athletics—Our activities in the field of athletics during the past year followed much the same pattern as in previous years. The Fall, Winter, and Spring program for both boys and girls teams were carried to successful conclusions by our coaches Mr. Antone Spath, Mrs. Martha Besse, Mrs. Anna McAvenia, and Miss Margaret Driscoll. The fine type of sportsmanship and team spirit exhibited by our teams is directly due to their high type of leadership.

One of the highlights of the past year was the honor brought to our school by the boys' basketball team which won the Class "C" Championship at the Brockton Y. M. C. A. tournament under the auspices of the South Shore High School Principals' Association. This was followed by an impressive testimonial banquet sponsored by the Hilltop Athletic Club which was attended by a large number of our most loyal supporters, the townspeople of Kingston.

The recent football season brought to the fore a long felt need—an adequate form of insurance protection for the members of our athletic teams. The specific instance was the first serious injury suffered by a member of our football team in seven years of play. The fact remains that it could have happened in any of the other sports, whether played by boys or girls. I recommend that serious consideration be given to providing this type of protection as soon as possible.

Lunchroom—The effects of the high cost of living are being felt in our School Lunch Program in much the same way that they are being felt in our homes. It was necessary for us to increase the cost of complete lunches to 16 cents in the Cobb School and to 21 cents in the High School. This increase

was due to two other factors not directly connected with higher prices. The first was loss of town support in the payment of salaries, a policy followed in past years under \$2,000 School Department appropriation. This new burden was assumed under a State law making such a town expenditure illegal under our present plan of operation. A second factor is the 20 per cent decrease in the amount of aid provided under Federal Lunch Program.

Several new pieces of equipment have been added to our kitchens under the non-Food Assistance Program of the Federal School Lunch Act. The equipment, including a dish-washing machine, potato peeler, and new sinks, was acquired at no cost to the town except for installation. These items have contributed greatly to our attempt to provide sanitary, wholesome, low cost meals to our pupils.

During the past year a total of 43,988 meals were served in both lunchroom units. This total includes 2,678 free lunches served to needy pupils and those pupils who help in operation of the lunch project. As in past, much credit is due to Miss Dorothy Oliver, her student helpers, the lunchroom managers, and their helpers for the smooth operation of this most vital feature of our school program.

Enrollment in Grades I and IV has been high and it was necessary to organize two first grades and two fourth grades. The two fourth grades of June 1947 were united into one fifth grade in September, thus creating an exceptionally large class.

At the present time, all Elementary School buildings are being used to capacity. The entering class in September will approximately number 55 thus furnishing enough pupils for two classes. As present enrollment figures indicate there will probably be two first grades, two second grades, one large third grade, one large fourth grade, two fifth grades, and one large sixth grade next fall. This provides pupils for nine classes and as there are only eight classrooms available the problem arises as to where to house the extra grade.

Teacher Changes—At Cobb School Mrs. Peck transferred from the second grade to teach in the extra first grade. Mrs. Shea is now teaching Grade II. Mrs. Lootz left Maple Avenue School to furnish remedial instruction to Grades II and III at Cobb School. She replaced Miss Baratta who is now teaching

in Bourne. Remedial instruction in Grade V at Maple Avenue has been assigned to Miss Peterson who conducts this work for half a day and teaches in Grade VI the rest of the time. Remedial instruction is given to those rooms which have over 10 pupils. Miss DiMarzio resigned in June to accept a position in Quincy and her place has been taken by Mr. Napoleone.

Stanford Achievement Tests were administered in January 1947 to obtain a comprehensive measure of the abilities and skills of the pupils. They were again administered in May 1947 to note the progress made by each pupil since January. Gates Reading Tests were given in the fall to determine reading achievement of pupils in remedial groups. First grade children received Metropolitan Readiness Tests in September. These tests were given again when the need for them arose. In October, third and sixth grade pupils were given Otis Mental Ability Tests.

The Course of Study begun by the teachers in January 1947 was completed in May. At present it is in the process of being typed so that each teacher in Union 40 may have a copy for reference.

Instruction on different levels has been continued in the classroom to provide opportunities for reading experience and to correlate all subjects wherever possible. In June 1947 a visiting day was held as a culminating activity for the units of work conducted during the year. The number of parents visiting school provided each room with an appreciative audience.

ART

During the year 1947, the Art Department has endeavored to stress two facts—the importance of nature as a source of design, and the practical application of art in all phases of life.

In the lower grades, all holidays were observed with appropriate room decorations and individual projects.

Several small displays were hung in the High School and the annual exhibition was held on Class Night.

MUSIC

The basic theorem which should support a school music program is this: that music is the natural heritage of all children regardless of talent and that it is up to the school to offer opportunities for every child to participate in the varied phases of music. Our immediate aims are to foster two important elements, pleasure and satisfaction, which motivate all our learning processes. These come through participation and with the aid of teachers, challenge the children to delve farther into the realm of music.

In our program from the first grade through high school we are trying to lead the students to a deeper appreciation of music through participation and listening.

This past year the high school chorus produced the operetta, "The Belle of Bagdad". The cast worked long and hard and produced a creditable performance. The chorus also had an important part in the graduation exercises last June.

At present the orchestra is going through a period of reorganization but it should develop into a fine group. The study of instruments has been started in the fifth grade in order to serve as replacements for losses through graduation.

SCHOOL NURSE

In addition to the usual health check-ups and home visits incidental to school absences, the facilities of the following state and county clinics were used:

Plymouth County Hospital: Physical examination, x-ray and patch test. 19 tested. All negative.

Bailey Health Camp: Xmas Seal Fund, 2 children. 8 weeks.

Crippled Children's Clinic, Brockton Hospital: Examinations for curvature of the spine, poor posture, post infantile condition, post Rheumatic Fever condition, etc. Re-visits, second Thursday of each month. Follow-up by State Department of Public Health. 11 children.

Speech Clinic, Brockton, Mass.: Recommended attendance for one year. Follow-up trips by parents. 3 children.

Child's Guidance Clinic, Brockton Hospital: Follow-up trips by parents. 4 children.

Kingston Dental Clinic: Fall clinic at Cobb School; Spring clinic at Maple Avenue School. 130 pupils treated by Dr. Bosworth, school dentist.

Kingston Diphtheria Clinic with Board of Health: Immunization and booster shots. 205 children.

Mass. Vision Test: All pupils tested except those with glasses. 401 tested; 46 partial failures, 29 failures. Follow-up: 24 examined by eye doctor, 22 now wearing glasses, 1 under treatment, and 1 discharged by doctor, glasses not necessary.

SCHOOL PHYSICIAN

A total of 516 examinations of school children were made following the opening of schools in September 1947.

Dear Sirs:

As requested, this is a report of the Finance Committee's activities for the year 1947.

The Committee, once again, followed its past practice of holding regular meetings on the first Tuesday of the month. In addition, a number of special meetings were called during the year to consider warrants for the special Town Meetings held in May and September, as well as to meet with Town Department heads who had requested transfer of funds to meet either over-expenditures in their departments or emergency funds.

Three articles in the warrant for the May special meeting were approved by the Committee, with revisions in the sums of money requested. Articles were presented to the Committee for the September meeting and actions taken were as follows:

Articles 1 and 2 were recommended for acceptance by the town.

Articles 3, 4, 5, of this warrant were not recommended for acceptance by the town.

Nine Department Heads appeared before the Finance Committee with requests for a transfer of funds from the

Reserve. Transfers, after proper consideration, were granted as follows:

**REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE
FINANCE COMMITTEE**

To the Voters of the Town of Kingston:

Your Finance Committee submits herewith its annual report and recommendations for your consideration at the 1948 annual town meeting.

In considering this year's budget, the Committee has been keenly aware of the two prime subjects of headline news—the high cost of living and town budgets reaching all-time highs. The Committee, therefore, set as its objective—to make our Town of Kingston the exception to the rule; and to keep the town expenditures in step with returns from new evaluations.

In considering the requests, both budget and warrant items, we first examined them in the light of this question: Is this expenditure essential to the town's welfare? Then we asked: If it is, is it necessary to make that expenditure this year?

When these two questions were answered in the positive, we then proceeded to examine the details of the request and to explore the possibilities of reductions. We received the whole-hearted co-operation of all departments and Board heads in this analysis.

THE RESULT:

If the articles in the budget and the warrant are passed as requested your Tax Rate will be about \$40.00 per thousand of evaluation.

If your Finance Committee recommendations are followed the tax rate should not exceed \$34.00 per thousand.

This report and recommendation is the result of many hours of deliberation. Each department has had full opportunity for discussion of any request. We believe our recommendations are to the best interests of the town and look forward to the voters' acceptance of these recommendations.

Once again, we emphasize the importance of a full attendance of the voters and tax-payers at the polls and at our annual town meeting.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of two radios for the Fire Department.

Recommend favorable action to an amount not exceeding \$1,200.00.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a truck for the Forest Fires Department, and authorize the Selectmen to turn in the pick-up truck now owned by the Forest Fires Department and apply the allowance thereof to the purchase price of a new truck.

Recommend favorable action to an amount not exceeding \$3,425.00.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of treating the water tank on Smith's Lane, both inside and outside, and to make some repairs to the old reservoir, and to meet the said appropriation transfer the following unexpended balances: Brookdale Street—\$2,024.72; Pembroke Street to the Jet. of Grove and Pembroke Streets—\$15.93; Kennedy Road—\$262.02; Kingston Shores—\$425.42; Sunset Avenue—\$2.47; Pick-up Truck—\$13.50.

Recommend favorable action as requested.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of replacing the 4" main on Spring Street with a 6" main.

Recommend favorable action not to exceed \$1,100.00.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the purpose of purchasing books for the Frederic C. Adams Public Library.

Recommend favorable action not to exceed \$200.00.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to adopt by-laws for the purpose of controlling horses, cattle or swine within the town.

Recommend favorable action.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to accept a strip of land on the southerly side of Main Street as laid out by the County Commissioners under Decree No. 829; said strip of land beginning at a stake on the street line of Elizabeth D. Clark, passing over the land of George A. and Mary A. Walsh

to a stake on the street line on the property of the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Boston.

Recommend favorable action.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to accept the lay-out as prepared by the Selectmen, filed with the Town Clerk, January 3, 1933, and purchase a certain parcel of land from a point on Rocky Nook Avenue to a point between said Avenue and West Avenue which is 39.88 feet, and from said point to a point on West Avenue which is 39.88 feet, and from this point on an arc which is 44.24 feet to the point of beginning, said portion of land containing 355 square feet, and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the purchase thereof.

Recommend favorable action.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1900 for the purpose of re-galvanizing the fence surrounding the Playground property.

Do not recommend Article 26.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to accept the way between Maple Street and the Old Colony Railroad, known as Wright Court, a distance of approximately 780 feet. (By petition).

Do not recommend Article 29.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to accept the way known as Leigh Road beginning at a point on the easterly side of Howland's Lane and running approximately 1,200 feet to a way known as Shore Drive, said Leigh Road to be laid out 10 feet in width.

Do not recommend Article 30 for lack of information.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to accept the way known as Shore Drive beginning at the northwesterly corner of Lot 1A, Plat D, Block 7, as shown on the Assessors plan on file in the Town House, thence running approximately 1,620 feet in a northwesterly direction to the land of Yvonne Daly.

To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning January 1, 1948 and to issue a note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with Section 17, Chapter 44, General Laws.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purpose of maintaining during the ensuing year, the mosquito control works as estimated and certified to by the State Reclamation Board in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 112, Acts of 1931.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate, or transfer from unappropriated available funds in the treasury, a sum of money for Chapter 90 Construction, or take any action in relation thereto.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a 2 ton truck for the Highway Department, and authorize the Selectmen to turn in the 1½ ton truck, now owned by the Highway Department and apply the allowance thereof to the purchase price of a new truck.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a tractor for the Highway Department.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2000 for the purpose of repairing and painting the Town House.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 to defray the expenses of the School Building Committee.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used by the School Committee or the School Building Committee, to establish and provide suitable quarters for school purposes, and to authorize the School Committee or the School Building Committee, with the approval of the Board of Selectmen, to determine the location thereof.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to establish a Regional High School Committee to be composed of three members, one to be appointed by the Moderator, one appointed by the School Committee and one appointed by the Board of Selectmen; said

Committee to report of their findings at any special town meeting or not later than the annual town meeting in March, 1949.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a new Police Cruiser, and authorize the Board of Selectmen to turn in the 1946 Hudson Police Cruiser and apply the allowance thereof to the purchase price of a new cruiser.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of two radios for the Fire Department.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a truck for the Forest Fires Department, and authorize the Selectmen to turn in the pick-up truck now owned by the Forest Fires Department and apply the allowance thereof to the purchase price of a new truck.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of treating the water tank on Smith's Lane, both inside and outside, and to make some repairs to the old reservoir, and to meet the said appropriation transfer the following unexpended balances: Brookdale Street—\$2,024.72; Pembroke Street to the Jet. of Grove and Pembroke Streets—\$15.93; Kennedy Road—\$262.02; Kingston Shores—\$425.42; Sunset Avenue—\$2.47; Pick-up Truck—\$13.50.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of replacing the 4-in. main on Spring Street with a 6 in. main.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the purpose of purchasing books for the Frederic C. Adams Public Library.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to adopt by-laws for the purpose of controlling horses, cattle or swine within the town.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to accept a strip of land on the southerly side of Main Street as laid out by the County Commissioners under Decree No. 829; said strip of land beginning at a stake on the street line of Elizabeth D. Clark, passing over the land of George A. and Mary A. Walsh to a stake on the street line on the property of the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Boston.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to accept the layout as prepared by the Selectmen, filed with the Town Clerk, January 3, 1933, and purchase a certain parcel of land from a point on Rocky Nook Avenue to a point between said Avenue and West Avenue which is 39.88 feet, and from said point to a point on West Avenue which is 39.88 feet, and from this point on an arc which is 44.24 feet to the point of beginning, said portion of land containing 355 square feet, and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the purchase thereof.
