

To the Residents of Kingston,

This afternoon the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (DPH) announced that there were 6,987 confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 in Plymouth County. This represents an increase of 112 from yesterday's count of 6,875. As of this afternoon the Town's total number of confirmed positive COVID-19 cases remains at 72. Of the Town's total number of confirmed positive cases, 35 are from one facility. Our Health Agent and Public Safety Officers will continue to monitor these local cases. Due to privacy requirements, the demographics of these cases will remain anonymous.



Yesterday at 10:30 AM PACTV aired a live COVID-19 Update for the Town of Kingston. The program featured Fire Chief Mark Douglass, who provided an update on the work being done to safely and responsibly reopen Town buildings and facilities. Plymouth County Commissioner Dan Pallotta also joined the conversation to discuss the County's efforts to administer \$90 million in federal CARES Act funding, which will be distributed to the 27 municipalities within Plymouth County. The broadcast will be replayed on Kingston's government channels (Comcast 15 and Verizon 42), and we have provided a link to the program on the Town's website.

The Kingston Recreation Department is soliciting feedback from families as to how they may utilize the department's summer program offerings.
